Conclusions				
 Validation of EN measurements can only be performed in the frequency domain by checking the overlap of PSDs measured at different sampling rates 				
• ECG website (free access): psd_ECG-COMON.exe for PSD calculation				
 Good PSD measurements (= good PSD overlaps) for very few commercial potentiostats (Gamry with ESA-410, Bio-logic?, IPS?) 				
 Even with good equipments, data provided by common users are often wrong: they do not set the right parameters in the setup for ENM 				
What can be done?				
The manufacturers should provide:				
 Improved software (no access to filters, no conflicting choice of f_s and I/E range limiting the frequency bandwidth) A tutorial for ENM with dummy cells for training users
