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De Rham logarithmic classes and Tate conjecture

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Abstract

We introduce the definition of De Rham logarithmic classes. We show that the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle of an algebraic variety over a field of characteristic zero is logarithmic and conversely that a logarithmic class of bidegree (d,d) is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension d). We deduce from a previous work the Tate conjecture for smooth projective varieties over fields of finite type over \mathbb{Q} , over p-adic fields and over field of characteristic p, p being a prime number.

1 Introduction

In this work, we introduce for X a noetherian scheme, the definition of logarithmic De Rham cohomology classes which are for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the subgroup $H^j OL_X(\mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X, \log})) \subset \mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X) =: H^j_{DR}(X)$ of the De Rham cohomology abelian group. Let X a smooth connected variety over a field of characteristic zero. To an algebraic cycle $Z \in \mathbb{Z}^d(X)$ one can associate its De Rham cohomology class $[Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X)$, which is by definition, as for any Weil cohomology theory, the image of the fundamental class $[Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR,Z}(X)$ by the canonical morphism $H^{2d}_{DR,Z}(X) \to H^{2d}(X)$. In section 3, we show (c.f. theorem 1(i)) that $[Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X)$ is logarithmic of bidegree (d, d), that is

$$[Z] = H^{2d}OL_X([Z]) \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X), \ [Z] \in H^{2d}OL_X(H^d_{et}(X, \Omega^d_{X, \log}))$$

where $H_{et}^d(X, \Omega_{X,\log}^d) \subset \mathbb{H}_{et}^{2d}(X, \Omega_{X,\log}^{\bullet})$ is the canonical subspace. The main ingredient is that the Euler class of a vector bundle of rank d over an algebraic variety is logarithmic of bidegree (d, d) (c.f. proposition 1). Conversely, we show (c.f. theorem 1(ii)), that a logarithmic class $w \in H_{DR}^{2d}(X)$ of bidegree (d, d) is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension d). The point is that a logarithmic class of bidegree (p,q) is locally acyclic for the Zariski topology of X since it is the etale cohomology of a single sheaf. This allows us to proceed by a finite induction and we use at the final step the fact that for a scheme $X', H_{et}^1(X', \Omega_{X',\log}^1) = H^1(X', O_{X'}^*)$ is the Picard group of X'. In the case X projective, we also get a vanishing result (c.f. theorem 1(iii)) : $H^{2d}OL_X(H_{et}^{d-k}(X, \Omega_{X,\log}^{d-k})) = 0$ for k > 0.

In a previous work (see [4], prop 2,3), we show that Tate classes $\alpha \in H^{2d}(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_p)(d)^G$ of a smooth algebraic variety X over a subfield of $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$ gives by the comparison isomorphism

$$H^{2d}R\alpha(X): H^{2d}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p) \otimes_{\mathbb{Z}_p} \mathbb{B}_{st,\mathbb{C}_p} \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{2d}_{DR}(X) \otimes_k \mathbb{B}_{st,\mathbb{C}_p}$$

a sum of \mathbb{Z}_p multiple of logarithmic classes

$$w(\alpha) := H^{2d} R\alpha(X)(\alpha) := \sum_{i=1}^{s} \lambda_i w(\alpha)_{L,i} \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}), \ \lambda_i \in \mathbb{Z}_p$$

with for each $1 \leq i \leq s$, $w(\alpha)_{L,i} \in H^{2d}OL_X \mathbb{H}^{2d}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\geq d}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p},\log})$. We deduce, for X projective, by theorem 1(ii) and (iii), the Tate cojecture (c.f. theorem 2).

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2 Preliminaries and Notations

- Denote by Top the category of topological spaces and RTop the category of ringed spaces.
- Denote by Cat the category of small categories and RCat the category of ringed topos.
- For $S \in \text{Cat}$ and $X \in S$, we denote $S/X \in \text{Cat}$ the category whose objects are Y/X := (Y, f) with $Y \in S$ and $f: Y \to X$ is a morphism in S, and whose morphisms Hom((Y', f'), (Y, f)) consists of $g: Y' \to Y$ in S such that $f \circ g = f'$.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in \text{Cat}$ denote $\text{Gr} \mathcal{S} := \text{Fun}(\mathbb{Z}, \mathcal{S})$ is the category of graded objects.
- Denote by Ab the category of abelian groups. For R a ring denote by Mod(R) the category of (left) R modules. We have then the forgetful functor $o_R : Mod(R) \to Ab$.
- Denote by AbCat the category of small abelian categories.
- For $(\mathcal{S}, O_S) \in \mathbb{R}$ Cat a ringed topos, we denote by
 - $\operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S})$ the category of presheaves of O_S modules on \mathcal{S} and $\operatorname{PSh}_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$ the category of presheaves of O_S modules on \mathcal{S} , whose objects are $\operatorname{PSh}_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})^0 := \{(M, m), M \in \operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S}), m : M \otimes O_S \to M\}$, together with the forgetful functor $o : \operatorname{PSh}(\mathcal{S}) \to \operatorname{PSh}_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$,
 - $-C(\mathcal{S}) = C(PSh(\mathcal{S}))$ and $C_{O_S}(\mathcal{S}) = C(PSh_{O_S}(\mathcal{S}))$ the big abelian category of complexes of presheaves of O_S modules on \mathcal{S} ,
 - $-C_{O_{S}(2)fil}(\mathcal{S}) := C_{(2)fil}(PSh_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})) \subset C(PSh_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S}), F, W), \text{ the big abelian category of (bi)filtered complexes of presheaves of } O_{S} \text{ modules on } \mathcal{S} \text{ such that the filtration is biregular and } PSh_{O_{S}(2)fil}(\mathcal{S}) = (PSh_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S}), F, W).$
- Let $(\mathcal{S}, O_S) \in \mathbb{R}$ Cat a ringed topos with topology τ . For $F \in C_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$, we denote by $k : F \to E_{\tau}(F)$ the canonical flasque resolution in $C_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$ (see [3]). In particular for $X \in \mathcal{S}$, $H^*(X, E_{\tau}(F)) \xrightarrow{\sim} \mathbb{H}^*_{\tau}(X, F)$.
- For $f : \mathcal{S}' \to \mathcal{S}$ a morphism with $\mathcal{S}, \mathcal{S}' \in \operatorname{RCat}$, endowed with topology τ and τ' respectively, we denote for $F \in C_{O_S}(\mathcal{S})$ and each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$,

$$-f^* := H^j \Gamma(\mathcal{S}, k \circ \mathrm{ad}(f^*, f_*)(F)) : \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}, F) \to \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}', f^*F), -f^* := H^j \Gamma(\mathcal{S}, k \circ \mathrm{ad}(f^{*mod}, f_*)(F)) : \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}, F) \to \mathbb{H}^j(\mathcal{S}', f^{*mod}F)$$

the canonical maps.

• For $\mathcal{X} \in \text{Cat a (pre)site and } p$ a prime number, we consider the full subcategory

$$\operatorname{PSh}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\mathcal{X}) \subset \operatorname{PSh}(\mathbb{N} \times \mathcal{X}), \ F = (F_n)_{n \in \mathbb{N}}, \ p^n F_n = 0, \ F_{n+1}/p^n \xrightarrow{\sim} F_n$$

 $C_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\mathcal{X}) := C(\mathrm{PSh}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\mathcal{X})) \subset C(\mathbb{N} \times \mathcal{X})$ and

$$\mathbb{Z}_p := \mathbb{Z}_{p,\mathcal{X}} := ((\mathbb{Z}/p^*\mathbb{Z})_{\mathcal{X}}) \in \mathrm{PSh}_{\mathbb{Z}_p}(\mathcal{X})$$

the diagram of constant presheaves on \mathcal{X} .

- Denote by Sch \subset RTop the subcategory of schemes (the morphisms are the morphisms of locally ringed spaces). For $X \in$ Sch, we denote by
 - $\operatorname{Sch}^{ft} / X \subset \operatorname{Sch} / X$ the full subcategory consisting of objects $X' / X = (X', f) \in \operatorname{Sch} / X$ such that $f : X' \to X$ is an morphism of finite type
 - X^{et} ⊂ Sch^{ft}/X the full subcategory consisting of objects $U/X = (X, h) \in$ Sch/X such that $h: U \to X$ is an etale morphism.

- X^{sm} ⊂ Sch^{ft}/X the full subcategory consisting of objects $U/X = (X, h) \in$ Sch/X such that $h: U \to X$ is a smooth morphism.

For a field k, we consider Sch/k := Sch/Spec k the category of schemes over Spec k. We then denote by

- Var(k) = Sch^{ft} /k ⊂ Sch /k the full subcategory consisting of algebraic varieties over k, i.e. schemes of finite type over k,
- $PVar(k) \subset QPVar(k) \subset Var(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of quasi-projective varieties and projective varieties respectively,
- $PSmVar(k) \subset SmVar(k) \subset Var(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of smooth varieties and smooth projective varieties respectively.

For a morphism of field $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow K$, we have the extention of scalar functor

 $\otimes_k K : \operatorname{Sch}/k \to \operatorname{Sch}/K, \ X \mapsto X_K := X_{K,\sigma} := X \otimes_k K, \ (f : X' \to X) \mapsto (f_K := f \otimes I : X'_K \to X_K).$ which is left ajoint to the restriction of scalar

$$Res_{k/K}: Sch/K \to Sch/k, \ X = (X, a_X) \mapsto X = (X, \sigma \circ a_X), \ (f: X' \to X) \mapsto (f: X' \to X)$$

The adjonction maps are

- for $X \in \operatorname{Sch}/k$, the projection $\pi_{k/K}(X) : X_K \to X$ in Sch/k , for $X = \bigcup_i X_i$ an affine open cover with $X_i = \operatorname{Spec}(A_i)$ we have by definition $\pi_{k/K}(X_i) = n_{k/K}(A_i)$,
- for $X \in \operatorname{Sch}/K$, $I \times \Delta_K : X \hookrightarrow X_K = X \times_K K \otimes_k K$ in Sch/K, where $\Delta_K : K \otimes_k K \to K$ is the diagonal which is given by for $x, y \in K$, $\Delta_K(x, y) = x y$.

The extention of scalar functor restrict to a functor

$$\otimes_k K : \operatorname{Var}(k) \to \operatorname{Var}(K), \ X \mapsto X_K := X_{K,\sigma} := X \otimes_k K, \ (f : X' \to X) \mapsto (f_K := f \otimes I : X'_K \to X_K).$$

and for $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ we have $\pi_{k/K}(X) : X_K \to X$ the projection in Sch/k. An algebraic variety $X \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$ is said to be defined over k if there exists $X_0 \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ such that $X \simeq X_0 \otimes_k K$ in $\operatorname{Var}(K)$. For $X = (X, a_X) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we have $\operatorname{Sch}^{ft}/X = \operatorname{Var}(k)/X$ since for $f : X' \to X$ a morphism of schemes of finite type, $(X', a_X \circ f) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ is the unique structure of variety over k of $X' \in \operatorname{Sch}$ such that f becomes a morphism of algebraic varieties over k, in particular we have

$$-X^{et} \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{ft} / X = \operatorname{Var}(k) / X,$$

$$-X^{sm} \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{ft} / X = \operatorname{Var}(k) / X.$$

A morphism $f: X' \to X$ with $X, X' \in Var(K)$ is said to be defined over k if $X \simeq X_0 \otimes_k K$ and $X' \simeq X'_0 \otimes_k K$ are defined over k and $\Gamma_f = \Gamma_{f_0} \otimes_k K \subset X' \times X$ is defined over k, so that $f_0 \otimes_k K = f$ with $f_0: X'_0 \to X_0$.

• For $X \in \text{Sch}$, we denote $X^{pet} \subset \text{Sch}/X$ the pro etale site (see [2]) which is the full subcategory of Sch/X whose object consists of weakly etale maps $U \to X$ (that is flat maps $U \to X$ such that $\Delta_U : U \to U \times_X U$ is also flat) and whose topology is generated by fpqc covers. We then have the canonical morphism of site

$$\nu_X: X^{pet} \to X, (U \to X) \mapsto (U \to X)$$

For $F \in C(X^{et})$,

$$\operatorname{ad}(\nu_X^*, R\nu_{X*})(F) : F \to R\nu_{X*}\nu_X^*F$$

is an isomorphism in $D(X^{et})$, in particular, for each $n \in \mathbb{Z}$

$$\nu_X^* : \mathbb{H}^n_{et}(X, F) \xrightarrow{\sim} \mathbb{H}^n_{pet}(X, \nu_X^* F)$$

are isomorphisms, For $X \in Sch$, we denote

- $\begin{aligned} &-\underline{\mathbb{Z}_p}_X := \varprojlim_{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_X^* (\mathbb{Z}/p^n \mathbb{Z})_{X^{et}} \in \mathrm{PSh}(X^{pet}) \text{ the constant presheaf on } \mathcal{X}, \\ &-l_{p,\mathcal{X}} := (p(*)) : \underline{\mathbb{Z}_p}_X \to \nu_X^* (\mathbb{Z}/p\mathbb{Z})_{X^{et}} \text{ the projection map in } \mathrm{PSh}(\mathbb{N} \times \mathcal{X}^{pet}). \end{aligned}$
- An affine scheme $U \in \text{Sch}$ is said to be *w*-contractible if any faithfully flat weakly etale map $V \to U$, $V \in \text{Sch}$, admits a section. We will use the facts that (see [2]):
 - Any scheme $X \in$ Sch admits a pro-etale affine cover $(r_i : X_i \to X)_{i \in I}$ with for each $i \in I$, X_i a *w*-contractile affine scheme and $r_i : X_i \to X$ a weakly etale map. For $X \in$ Var(k) with k a field, we may assume I finite since the topological space X is then quasi-compact.
 - If $U \in \text{Sch}$ is a *w*-contractible affine scheme, then for any sheaf $F \in \text{Shv}(U^{pet})$, $H^i_{pet}(U, F) = 0$ for $i \neq 0$ since $\Gamma(U, -)$ is an exact functor.
- Let $X = (X, O_X) \in \mathbb{R}$ Cat a ringed topos, we have in C(X) the subcomplex of presheaves of abelian group

$$OL_X : \Omega^{\bullet}_{X,\log} \hookrightarrow \Omega^{\bullet}_X, \text{ s.t. for } X^o \in X \text{ and } p \in \mathbb{N},$$
$$\Omega^p_{X,\log}(X^0) := \langle df_{\alpha_1}/f_{\alpha_1} \wedge \cdots \wedge df_{\alpha_p}/f_{\alpha_p}, f_{\alpha} \in \Gamma(X^o, O_X)^* \rangle \subset \Omega^p_X(X^0),$$

where $\Omega^{\bullet}_X := DR(X)(O_X) \in C(X)$ is the De Rham complex and $\Gamma(X^o, O_X)^* \subset \Gamma(X^o, O_X)$ is the subring consisting of inversible elements for the multiplication.

- Let $X \in$ Sch. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega^{\bullet}_X := DR(X)(O_X)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X)$. If $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$, then $H^j_{DR}(X) = \mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X)$ since $\Omega^{\bullet} \in C(\text{SmVar}(k))$ is \mathbb{A}^1 local and admits transfert (see [3]).
- Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $X = \bigcup_{i=1}^{s} X_i$ an open affine cover. For $I \subset [1, \ldots, s]$, we denote $X_I := \bigcap_{i \in I} X_i$. We get $X_{\bullet} \in \operatorname{Fun}(P([1, \ldots, s]), \operatorname{Var}(k))$. Since quasi-coherent sheaves on affine noetherian schemes are acyclic, we have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, $H_{DR}^{j}(X) = \Gamma(X_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X^{\bullet}}^{\bullet})$.
- For $X \in \text{Sch}$ noetherian irreducible and $d \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^d(X)$ the group of algebraic cycles of codimension d, which is the free abelian group generated by irreducible closed subsets of codimension d.
- Denote by $\operatorname{AnSp}(\mathbb{C}) \subset \operatorname{RTop}$ the full subcategory of analytic spaces over \mathbb{C} , and by $\operatorname{AnSm}(\mathbb{C}) \subset \operatorname{AnSp}(\mathbb{C})$ the full subcategory of smooth analytic spaces (i.e. complex analytic manifold). Denote by $\operatorname{CW} \subset \operatorname{Top}$ the full subcategory of CW complexes. Denote by $\operatorname{Diff}(\mathbb{R}) \subset \operatorname{RTop}$ the full subcategory of differentiable (real) manifold.
- For $X \in$ Top and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset, denoting $j : X \setminus Z \hookrightarrow X$ the open complementary, we will consider

 $\Gamma_Z^{\vee} \mathbb{Z}_X := \operatorname{Cone}(\operatorname{ad}(j_!, j^*)(\mathbb{Z}_X) : j_! j^* \mathbb{Z}_X \hookrightarrow \mathbb{Z}_X) \in C(X)$

and denote for short $\gamma_Z^{\vee} := \gamma_X^{\vee}(\mathbb{Z}_X) : \mathbb{Z}_X \to \Gamma_Z^{\vee}\mathbb{Z}_X$ the canonical map in C(X).

3 De Rham logarithmic classes

Let $X \in \text{Sch.}$ Recall we have the canonical subcomplex $OL_X : \Omega^{\bullet}_{X,\log} \hookrightarrow \Omega^{\bullet}_X$ in $C(X^{et})$. For $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the De Rham logarithmic classes consist of the image

$$H^{j}OL_{X}(\mathbb{H}^{j}_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X, \log})) \subset \mathbb{H}^{j}_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X}) = H^{j}_{DR}(X).$$

The filtered complex $\Gamma(X, E_{et}(\Omega_{X^{et}, \log}^{\bullet}, F_b)) \in C_{fil}(\mathbb{Z})$ has its differentials at the E_1 level trivial since all the logarithmic forms are closed, hence we have a canonical splitting

$$\mathbb{H}^{\mathcal{I}}_{et}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X, \log}) = \bigoplus_{0 \le l \le j} H^{\mathcal{I}-l}_{et}(X, \Omega^{l}_{X, \log}).$$

Let $X \in$ Sch a noetherian scheme. We have by definition the exact sequence in $C(X^{et})$

$$0 \to \mathbb{Z}_X \to O_X^* \xrightarrow{dlog} \Omega_{X,\log} \to 0$$

Hence $H^1_{et}(X, \Omega_{X, \log}) = H^1_{et}(X, O^*_X)$ and $H^q_{et}(X, \Omega_{X, \log}) = H^q_{et}(X, O^*_X) = 0$ for $q \leq 2$. Let $X \in$ Sch a noetherian proper scheme. We have $H^0(X, \Omega^l_{X, \log}) = 0$.

We will use the following lemma :

Lemma 1. Let $X \in \text{Sch.}$ Let $X = \bigcup_{i \in I} X_i$ an open cover. Denote $j_i : X_i \hookrightarrow X$ the open embeddings. Let $w \in H^j_{DR}(X)$. Then $w \in H^jOL_X(H^{j-l}_{et}(X, \Omega^l_{X, \log}))$ if and only if $j_i^*w \in H^jOL_X(H^{j-l}_{et}(X_i, \Omega^l_{X, \log}))$ for all $i \in I$.

Proof. The only if part is obvious. Considering the morphism of bicomplexes of abelian groups

$$\Gamma(X_{\bullet}, E_{et}^{\bullet}(\Omega^l_{X, \log})) \hookrightarrow \Gamma(X_{\bullet}, E_{et}^{\bullet}(\Omega^l_X))$$

the if part follows from Mayer-Vietoris (i.e. etale hence Zariski descent of flasque etale sheaves). \Box

Let $X \in \text{Sch}$ a smooth connected noetherian scheme (X is quasi-compact since X is noetherian) and $Z \subset X$ a smooth subscheme of codimension d we have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the purity isomorphism given by excision (using the deformation $(\tilde{X}', \tilde{Z}') \to \mathbb{A}^1$, $(\tilde{X}', \tilde{Z}') \in \text{Sch}^2$ of a pair $(X', Z') \in \text{Sch}^2$ by the normal cone $C_{Z'/X'} \to Z'$, i.e. such that $(\tilde{X}', \tilde{Z}')_s = (X', Z')$ for $s' \in \mathbb{A}^1 \setminus 0$ and $(\tilde{X}', \tilde{Z}')_0 = (C_{Z'/X}, Z')$) and the cup product with the Euler class of the normal tangent bundle $N_{Z/X} \to Z$:

$$((-) \cdot e(N_{Z/X}))^{-1} : H^j_{DR,Z}(X) = H^j_{DR,Z^o}(N_{Z/X}) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{j-2d}_{DR}(Z).$$

Let k a field of characteristic zero. For $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$ connected, we have the cycle class map for De Rham cohomology

$$Z \in \mathcal{Z}^d(X) \mapsto [Z] := H^{2d}\Omega(\gamma_Z^{\vee})([Z]) \subset H^{2d}_{DR}(X), \ [Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR,|Z|}(X),$$
$$H^{2d}\Omega(\gamma_Z^{\vee}) : H^{2d}_{DR,|Z|}(X) \to H^{2d}_{DR}(X)$$

where

$$\Omega(\gamma_Z^{\vee}) := \operatorname{Hom}(\gamma_Z^{\vee}(\mathbb{Z}_X), E_{et}(\Omega_X^{\bullet})) : \Gamma_Z(X, E_{et}(\Omega_X^{\bullet})) \hookrightarrow \Gamma(X, E_{et}(\Omega_X^{\bullet}))$$

and, as for any Weil cohomology theory, we have the purity isomorphism given by excision and the cup product with the Euler class of the normal tangent bundle $N_{Z^o/X^o} \to Z^o, X^o \subset X$ being a open subset such that $Z^o := X^o \cap Z$ has smooth components :

$$((-) \cdot e(N_{Z^o/X^o}))^{-1} : H^{2d}_{DR,|Z|}(X) = H^{2d}_{DR,|Z^o|}(X^o) = H^{2d}_{DR,|Z^o|}(N_{Z^o/X^o}) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^0_{DR}(|Z^o|).$$

where the first equality follows from dimension reason : for $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$ and $Z' \subset X$ smooth, we have $H^i_{DR,Z'}(X) = 0$ for $i < 2 \operatorname{codim}(Z', X)$ by the purity isomorphism.

We have the following key proposition:

Proposition 1. Let k a field of characteristic zero. Let $p : E \to X$ a vector bundle of rank $d \in \mathbb{N}$ with $X, E \in \text{SmVar}(k)$ connected. Then

- (i) the Euler class $e(E) \in H^{2d}_{DR,X}(E)$ is logarithmic of type (d,d), that is $e(E) = H^{2d}OL_E(e(E)) \in H^{2d}_{DR,X}(E)$ with $e(E) \in H^d_{X\,et}(E, \Omega^d_{E\,\log})$,
- (ii) the Euler class $e(E) \in H^{2d}_{DB_X}(E)$ induces for each $i, j \in \mathbb{Z}$ an isomorphism

$$((-) \cdot e(E)) : H^{i+j}OL_X(H^j_{et}(X, \Omega^i_{X, \log})) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{2d+i+j}OL_E(H^{j+d}_{et}(E, \Omega^{i+d}_{E, \log}))$$

Proof. (i):Let $X = \bigcup_i X_i$ an open affine cover such that $E_i := E_{|X_i|}$ is trivial : $(s_1, \cdots, s_d) : E_{|X_i|} \xrightarrow{\sim} X_i \times \mathbb{A}^d$ with $s_j \in \Gamma(X_i, E)$. Then

$$e(E)_{|X_i|} = \partial(ds_1/s_1 \wedge \dots \wedge ds_d/s_d) \in H^{2d}OL_{E_i}(H^d_{X_i}(E_i, \Omega^d_{E,\log}))$$

where $\partial: H^{d-1}(E_i \setminus X_i, \Omega^d_{E, \log}) \to H^d_{X_i}(E_i, \Omega^d_{E, \log})$ is the boundary map. Hence

$$e(E) \in H^{2d}OL_E(H^0(E, H^d_X\Omega^d_{E,\log})) = H^d_{et,X}(E, \Omega^d_{E,\log}) \subset H^0(E, H^{2d}_X\Omega^{\bullet \ge d}_E) \subset H^{2d}_{DR,X}(E).$$

(ii):Follows from (i) and Kunneth formula for De Rham cohomology together with lemma 1.

The result of this section is the following :

Theorem 1. Let k a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$ connected. Let $d \in \mathbb{N}$.

(i) The De Rham cohomology class of an algebraic cycle is logarithmic and is of type (d, d), that is, for $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^d(X)$

$$[Z] := H^{2d}\Omega(\gamma_Z^{\vee})([Z]) \subset H^{2d}OL_X(H^d_{et}(X,\Omega^d_{X,\log})) \subset H^{2d}_{DR}(X)$$

- (ii) Conversely, any $w \in H^{2d}OL_X(H^d_{et}(X, \Omega^d_{X, \log}))$ is the class of an algebraic cycle.
- (iii) If $X \in PSmVar(k)$, $H^{2d}OL_X(H^{d-k}_{et}(X, \Omega^{d+k}_{X, \log})) = 0$ for k > 0.

Proof. (i):We have

$$[Z] := H^{2d}\Omega(\gamma_Z^{\vee})([Z]) = H^{2d}OL_X \circ H^d\Omega^d_{\log}(\gamma_Z^{\vee})([Z]) \subset H^{2d}_{DR}(X), \ [Z] \in H^d_{et,|Z|}(X,\Omega^d_{X,\log})$$

where

$$\Omega^d_{\log}(\gamma^{\vee}_Z) := \operatorname{Hom}(\gamma^{\vee}_Z(\mathbb{Z}_X), E_{et}(\Omega^d_{X,\log})) : \Gamma_Z(X, E_{et}(\Omega^d_{X,\log})) \hookrightarrow \Gamma(X, E_{et}(\Omega^d_{X,\log})),$$

since if $X^o \subset X$ is a Zariski open subset such that $Z^o := X^o \cap Z$ has smooth components and $N_{Z^o/X^o} \to Z^o$ is the normal tangent bundle, proposition 1 implies that the Euler class of N_{Z^o/X^o} induces the isomorphism

$$((-) \cdot e(N_{Z^{o}/X^{o}}))^{-1} : H^{2d}OL_{X}(H^{d}_{et,|Z|}(X,\Omega^{d}_{X,\log})) = H^{2d}OL_{X}(H^{d}_{et,|Z^{o}|}(X^{o},\Omega^{d}_{X^{o},\log}))$$

= $H^{2d}OL_{X}(H^{d}_{et,|Z^{o}|}(N_{Z^{o}/X^{o}},\Omega^{d}_{N_{Z^{o}/X^{o}},\log})).$

Note that the excision isomorphism being motivic preserve logarithmic classes. (ii):By assumption we have

$$w = H^{2d}OL_X(w) \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X), \ w \in H^d_{et}(X, \Omega^d_{X, \log})$$

As $\Omega_{X,\log}^d \in PSh(X^{et})$ consist of a single presheaf, that is a complex of presheaves concentrated one degree, there exist an etale open cover $r = r(w) = (r_i : X_i \to X)_{1 \le i \le s}$, depending on w, such that $r_i^*w = 0 \in H_{et}^d(X_i, \Omega_{X,\log}^d)$ for each i. Choose i = 1 and denote $j : U := r_1(X_1) \to X$ the corresponding Zariski open subset. As $\Omega_{X,\log}^d$ has no torsion and admits transfert, we have $j^*w = 0 \in H_{et}^d(U, \Omega_{X,\log}^d)$. Hence, denoting $D := X \setminus U$, we have

$$w = H^{2d}OL_X(w), w \in \Omega^d_{\log}(\gamma^{\vee}_D)(H^d_{et,D}(X, \Omega^d_{X,\log})).$$

We may assume, up to shinking U, that $D \subset X$ is a divisor. Denote $D^o \subset D$ its smooth locus and $l: X^o \hookrightarrow X$ a Zariski open subset such that $X^o \cap D = D^o$. We then have by proposition 1

$$l^*w \in ((-) \cdot e(N_{D^o/X^o}))(H^{2d-2}OL_D(H^{d-1}_{et}(D^o, \Omega^{d-1}_{D^o, \log})))$$

We repeat this procedure with each connected components of D^o instead of X. By a finite induction of d steps, we get

$$w = H^{2d}OL_X(w), \ w \in \Omega^d_{\log}(\gamma_Z^{\vee})(H^d_{et,Z}(X, \Omega^d_{X,\log})),$$

with $Z := D_d \subset \cdots \subset D \subset X$ a codimension d Zariski closed subset and $w = [Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X)$, using in the final step the isomorphism

$$H^{1}_{et}(D^{o}_{d-1}, \Omega_{D^{o}_{d-1}, \log}) = H^{1}_{et}(D^{o}_{d-1}, O^{*}_{D_{d-1}}) = Pic(D^{o}_{d-1})$$

(iii):Follows from the proof of (ii) and the fact that for $X' \in PSmVar(k)$, $H^0(X', \Omega^l_{X',log}) = 0$ for all l > 0.

Let $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$ a subfield. Let $X \in Var(k)$. We will write for short

$$OL_X := OL_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et}, \mathcal{O}} : \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et}, \log, \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet} := \Omega_{X_{O_{\mathbb{C}_p}}^{et}, \log}^{\bullet} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et}}^{\bullet}$$

the embedding in $C(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et})$. We will also consider

$$m \circ (OL_X \otimes I) : \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p := \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}} \otimes \underline{\mathbb{Z}_p}_X \to \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}}, \ w \otimes \lambda \mapsto \lambda \cdot u$$

in $C(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{pet})$. Note that

$$\Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p},\log,\mathcal{O}} := \nu^*_X \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{et}_{\mathbb{C}_p},\log,\mathcal{O}} \in C(X^{pet}),$$

but

$$\underline{\mathbb{Z}_p}_X := \varprojlim_{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_X^* (\mathbb{Z}/p^n \mathbb{Z})_{X^{et}} \in C(X^{pet}), \text{ and } \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p \in C(X^{pet})$$

are NOT the pullback of etale sheaves by ν_X .

Proposition 2. Let k a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$. Let $\sigma : k \to \mathbb{C}$ an embedding.

(i) Let
$$w \in H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X) = \mathbb{H}^j_{pet}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X)$$
. If
 $w \in H^jOL_X(\mathbb{H}^j_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{et}_{\mathbb{C}}, \log}))$

then $H^j ev(X)(w) \in H^j_{sing}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, 2i\pi\mathbb{Q}).$

(ii) Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number and $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$ an embedding. Let $j \in \mathbb{Z}$. Let $w \in H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X) = \mathbb{H}^j_{pet}(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X)$. If

$$w := \pi_{k/\mathbb{C}_p}(X)^* w \in H^j OL_X(\mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et}, \log, \mathcal{O}}))$$

then
$$H^j ev(X)(w) \in H^j_{sing}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, 2i\pi\mathbb{Q})$$
. Recall that $\mathbb{H}^j_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}}) = \mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{et}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}})$.

Proof. (i): Let

$$w \in H^j_{DR}(X) := \mathbb{H}^j(X, \Omega^{\bullet}_X) = H^j \Gamma(X_{\bullet}, \Omega^{\bullet}_X).$$

where $(r_i: X_i \to X)_{1 \le i \le s}$ is an affine etale cover. Let $X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}} = \cup_{i=1}^r \mathbb{D}_i$ an open cover with $\mathbb{D}_i \simeq D(0, 1)^d$. Denote $j_{IJ}: X_I \cap \mathbb{D}_J \hookrightarrow X_I$ the open embeddings. Then by definition $H^j ev(X)(w) = H^j ev(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})(j^* \circ an^*_{X_{\bullet}} w)$ with

$$j_{\bullet}^* \circ \operatorname{an}_{X_{\bullet}}^* w \in H^j \Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}}^{an} \cap \mathbb{D}_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}^{\bullet}).$$

Now, if $w = H^j OL_X(\mathbb{H}^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{et}_{\mathbb{C}}, \log}))$, we have a canonical splitting

$$w = \sum_{l=0}^{j} w_{L}^{l,j-l} = \sum_{l=d}^{j} w^{l,j-l} \in H_{DR}^{j}(X_{\mathbb{C}}), \ w_{L}^{l,j-l} \in H^{j-l}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{et}, \log}^{l}), \ w^{l,j-l} := H^{j}OL_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{et}}(w_{L}^{l,j-l}).$$

Let $0 \le l \le j$. Using an affine w-contractile pro-etale cover of X, we see that there exists an affine etale cover $r = r(w^{l,j-l}) = (r_i : X_i \to X)_{1 \le i \le n}$ of X (depending on $w^{l,j-l}$) such that

$$w^{l,j-l} = [(w_{L,I}^{l,j-l})_I] \in H^j OL_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{et}}(H^{j-l}\Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C},\bullet},\Omega^l_{X_{\mathbb{C}},\log})) \subset \mathbb{H}^j \Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C},\bullet},\Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}}).$$

Note that since X is an algebraic variety, this also follows from a comparison theorem between Chech cohomology of etale covers and etale cohomology. By [4] lemma, we may assume, up to take a desingularization $\pi : X' \to X$ of $(X, \bigcup_i (r_i(X \setminus X_i)))$ and replace w with $\pi^* w$, that $r_i(X_i) = r_i(X_i(w)) = X \setminus D_i$ with $D_i \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing For $1 \leq l \leq j$, we get

$$w_{L,I}^{l,j-l} = \sum_{\nu} df_{\nu_1} / f_{\nu_1} \wedge \dots \wedge df_{\nu_l} / f_{\nu_l} \in \Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C},I}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}}^l).$$

For l = 0, we get

$$w^{0,j} = [(\lambda_I)] \in H^j \Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C},I}, O_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p,I}}), \ \lambda_I \in \Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C},I}, \mathbb{Z}_{X_{\mathbb{C},I}^{et}})$$

There exists $k' \subset \mathbb{C}$ containing k such that $w_{L,I}^{l,j-l} \in \Gamma(X_{k',I}, \Omega_{X_{k'}}^l)$ for all $0 \leq l \leq j$. Take an embedding $\sigma' : k' \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ such that $\sigma'_{|k|} = \sigma$. We then have

$$j_{\bullet}^* \circ \operatorname{an}_{X_{\bullet}}^* w = j_{\bullet}^* ((m_l \cdot w_L^{l,j-l})_{0 \le l \le j}) = (w_{L,I,J}^{l,j-l})_{l,I,J} \in H^j \Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}}^{an} \cap \mathbb{D}_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}^{\bullet}).$$

where for each (I, J, l) with cardI + cardJ + l = j,

$$w_{L,I,J}^{l,j-l} := j_{IJ}^* w_{L,I}^{l,j-l} \in \Gamma(X_{I,\mathbb{C}}^{an} \cap \mathbb{D}_J, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}^l)$$

We have by a standard computation, for each (I, J, l) with cardI + cardJ + l = j,

$$H^*_{\operatorname{sing}}(X^{an}_{I,\mathbb{C}} \cap \mathbb{D}_J, \mathbb{Z}) = <\gamma_1, \cdots, \gamma_{cardI} > .$$

On the other hand,

- $w_{L,I,J}^{l,j-l} = j_J^*(\sum_{\nu} df_{\nu_1}/f_{\nu_1} \wedge \dots \wedge df_{\nu_l}/f_{\nu_l}) \in \Gamma(X_{I,\mathbb{C}}^{an} \cap \mathbb{D}_J, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}}^l)$ for $1 \le l \le j$,
- $w_{L,I,J}^{0,j} = \lambda_I$ is a constant.

Hence, for $\mu \in P([1, \dots, s])$ with $card\mu = l$, we get, for l = 0 $H^l ev(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}})_{I,J}(w^{0,j}_{L,I,J}) = 0$ and, for $1 \leq l \leq j$,

$$H^{l}ev(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an})_{I,J}(w_{L,I,J}^{l,j-l})(\gamma_{\mu}) = \sum_{k} \delta_{\nu,\mu} \in 2i\pi\mathbb{Z}.$$

where $\gamma_{\mu} := \gamma_{\mu_1} \cdots \gamma_{\mu_l}$. We conclude by [4] lemma.

(ii):See [4] proposition 1. Note that it follows immediately from (i).

Let k a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$. Let $X = \bigcup_{i=1}^{s} X_i$ an open affine cover with $X_i := X \setminus D_i$ with $D_i \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing. Let $\sigma : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number and $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$ an embedding. By proposition 2, we have a commutative diagram of graded algebras

$$\begin{array}{c} H^*_{DR}(X) & \xrightarrow{H^*ev(X)} & \to H^*_{\mathrm{sing}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \mathbb{C}) \\ & \swarrow \\ & & \uparrow \\ H^*OL_X(\mathbb{H}^*_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{pet}_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}})) \cap H^*_{DR}(X) & \xrightarrow{H^*ev(X)} & \to H^*_{\mathrm{sing}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, 2i\pi\mathbb{Q}) \end{array}$$

where

$$C^*\iota_{2i\pi\mathbb{Q}/\mathbb{C}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}): C^{\bullet}_{\operatorname{sing}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, 2i\pi\mathbb{Q}) \hookrightarrow C^{\bullet}_{\operatorname{sing}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \mathbb{C})$$

is the subcomplex consisting of $\alpha \in C^j_{\text{sing}}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \mathbb{C})$ such that $\alpha(\gamma) \in 2i\pi\mathbb{Q}$ for all $\gamma \in C^{\text{sing}}_j(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}, \mathbb{Q})$. Recall that

$$H^*ev(X_{\mathbb{C}}) = H^*R\Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, \alpha(X)) \circ \Gamma(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, E_{zar}(\Omega(\mathrm{an}_X))) : H^*_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}}) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^*_{\mathrm{sing}}(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, \mathbb{C})$$

is the canonical isomorphism induced by the analytical functor and $\alpha(X) : \mathbb{C}_{X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}} \hookrightarrow \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}}}$, which gives the periods elements $H^*ev(X)(H^*_{DR}(X)) \subset H^*_{sing}(X^{an}_{\mathbb{C}},\mathbb{C})$. On the other side the induced map

 $H^*ev(X_{\mathbb{C}}): H^*OL_X(\mathbb{H}^*_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{et}, \log})) \hookrightarrow H^*\iota_{2i\pi\mathbb{Q}/\mathbb{C}}H^*_{\operatorname{sing}}(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{an}, 2i\pi\mathbb{Q})$

is NOT surjective in general since the left hand side is invariant by the action of the group $Aut(\mathbb{C})$ (the group of field automorphism of \mathbb{C}) whereas the right hand side is not. The fact for a de Rham cohomology class of being logarithmic is algebraic and invariant under isomorphism of (abstract) schemes.

Corollary 1. Let $X \in PSmVar(\mathbb{C})$. Then the Hodge conjecture holds for X if and only if the Hodge classes are given by logarithmic De Rham classes.

Proof. Follows from theorem 1.

4 Tate conjecture

Let k a field of finite type over \mathbb{Q} . Denote \bar{k} the algebraic closure of k and $G = Gal(\bar{k}/k)$ the absolute Galois group of k. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ a smooth variety. Take a compactification $\bar{X} \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$ of X such that $D := \bar{X} \setminus X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor, and denote $j : X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ the open embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_p} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$, where \hat{k}_{σ_p} is the p-adic field which is the completion of k with respect the p adic norm given by σ_p . Denote $\hat{G}_{\sigma_p} = Gal(\mathbb{C}_p/\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}) = Gal(\bar{\mathbb{Q}}_p/\hat{k}_{\sigma_p})$ the Galois group of \hat{k}_{σ_p} . Recall (see section 2) that $\underline{\mathbb{Z}}_{p_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}}} := \varprojlim_{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_X^*(\mathbb{Z}/p^n\mathbb{Z})_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{et}} \in \operatorname{Shv}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{pet})$ and $\Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{pet},\log,\mathcal{O}} := \Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathcal{O}_p}^{pet},\log} \in C(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{pet})$. We have then the commutative diagram in $C_{\mathbb{B}_{dr}fil,\hat{G}_{\sigma_n}}(\bar{X}_{\mathbb{C}_p}^{an,pet})$

$$j_*E_{pet}(\mathbb{B}_{dr,X_{\mathbb{C}_p}},F) \xrightarrow{j_*E_{pet}(\alpha(X))} E_{pet}((\Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}}(\log D_{\mathbb{C}_p}),F_b) \otimes_{O_{\bar{X}_{\mathbb{C}_p}}} (O\mathbb{B}_{dr,\bar{X}_{\mathbb{C}_p},\log},F)) \xrightarrow{j_*E_{pet}(j_*\iota'_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}})_{j}:=E_{pet}(l\mapsto l.1)_j} \xrightarrow{j_*E_{pet}(\iota_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}})_{j}:=E_{pet}((w\otimes\lambda)\mapsto(w\otimes\lambda))} \xrightarrow{j_*E_{pet}(u_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}})_{j}:=E_{pet}((w\otimes\lambda)\mapsto(w\otimes\lambda))} \xrightarrow{j_*E_{pet}(u_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}})_{j}:=E_{pet}(\Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p},\log,\mathcal{O}}\otimes\underline{Z}_p_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}},F_b)}$$

where for $j': U' \hookrightarrow X'$ an open embedding with $X' \in \operatorname{RTop}$ and τ a topology on RTop we denote for $m: j_*Q \to Q'$ with $Q \in \operatorname{PSh}_O(U'), Q' \in \operatorname{PSh}_O(X')$ the canonical map in $C_O(X')$

$$E^0_{\tau}(m)_j : j_* E^0_{\tau}(Q) \to E^0_{\tau}(j_*Q) \xrightarrow{E^0_{\tau}(m)} E^0_{\tau}(Q'),$$

giving by induction the canonical map $E_{\tau}(m)_j : j_*E_{\tau}(Q) \to E_{\tau}(Q')$ in $C_O(X')$. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \in \delta(k, X)$ a prime number (any but finitely many) so that $\hat{k}_{\sigma_p} = Frac(W(O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}/pO_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}))$ and so that the canonical model $(\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}}, D^{\mathcal{O}}) \in \operatorname{Sch}^2 / O_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}$ of $(\bar{X}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}, D_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}) \in \operatorname{PSmVar}^2(\hat{k}_{\sigma_p})$ has good or semi-stable reduction modulo p. We have then the morphisms of sites

$$v_{X,N}: (X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})^{Falt} \to (X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})^{ket}, \ u_{X,N}: (X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, M_{Z_{\mathbb{C}_p}})^{ket} \to (X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})^{Falt}$$

where $(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})^{Falt}$ denote the Falting site, and for $(Y, N) \in \text{logSch}, (Y, N)^{ket} \subset \text{logSch}/(Y, N)$ is the small Kummer etale site. If $(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_n}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})$ is log smooth, we consider an hypercover

$$a_{\bullet}: (X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}, \bullet}, N_{U, \mathcal{O}}) \to (X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U, \mathcal{O}})$$

in Fun(Δ , logSch) by small log schemes in sense of [1]. The main result of [1] say that the embedding in $C((\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{v}}})^{Falt})$

$$\alpha(X): \mathbb{B}_{st, \bar{X}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}, \log} \hookrightarrow a_{\bullet *} \Omega^{\bullet}_{X^{\mathcal{O}, \bullet}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}}(\log D_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}) \otimes_{O_X \mathcal{O}} O\mathbb{B}_{st, \bar{X}^{\bullet}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}, \log}$$

is a filtered quasi-isomorphism compatible with the action of the Frobenius ϕ_p and the monodromy N. This gives if $(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U,\mathcal{O}})$ is log smooth, for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, a filtered isomorphism of filtered abelian groups

$$H^{j}R\alpha(X): H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}) \otimes_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}} \mathbb{B}_{st,\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \xrightarrow{H^{j}T(a_{X},\mathbb{B}_{st})^{-1}} H^{j}_{et}((X, N)^{Falt})(\mathbb{B}_{st,\bar{X}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}},\log})$$
$$\xrightarrow{H^{j}R\Gamma((\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}, D_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}),\alpha(X))} H^{j}_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}) \otimes_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \mathbb{B}_{st,\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$$

compatible with the action of $Gal(\mathbb{C}_p/\hat{k}_{\sigma_p})$, of the Frobenius ϕ_p and the monodromy N.

Definition 1. Let k a field of finite type over \mathbb{Q} . Denote \bar{k} the algebraic closure of k and $G = Gal(\bar{k}/k)$ the absolute Galois group of k. Let $X \in SmVar(k)$ a smooth variety. Take a compactification $\bar{X} \in PSmVar(k)$ of X such that $D := \bar{X} \setminus X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor, and denote $j : X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ the open embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \setminus \delta(k, X)$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_p} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$, where \hat{k}_{σ_p} is the p-adic field which is the completion of k with respect the p adic norm given by σ_p . For $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$, we consider

$$w(\alpha) := H^j R\alpha(X)(\alpha \otimes 1) \in H^j_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_n}}) \otimes_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_n}} \mathbb{B}_{st,\hat{k}_{\sigma_n}}.$$

the associated de Rham class by the p adic periods. We recall

$$H^{j}R\alpha(X): H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}) \otimes_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}} \mathbb{B}_{st, \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{j}_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}) \otimes_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \mathbb{B}_{st, \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$$

is the canonical filtered isomorphism compatible with the action of \hat{G}_{σ_p} , of the Frobenius ϕ_p and the monodromy N.

We have the following key propositions (see [4]):

Proposition 3. Let k a field of finite type over \mathbb{Q} . Let $X \in \text{SmVar}(k)$. Take a compactification $\overline{X} \in \text{PSmVar}(k)$ of X such that $D := \overline{X} \setminus X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor. Let $p \in \mathbb{N} \in \delta(k, X)$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$. Let $j, l \in \mathbb{Z}$. We have then

$$F^{l}H^{j}_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}})\cap H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\mathbb{Z}_{p}) = H^{j}(m \circ (OL_{X} \otimes I))(\Omega^{\bullet \geq l}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\log,\mathcal{O}} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p}) \subset H^{j}_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}) \otimes_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}} \mathbb{B}_{st,\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}$$

where we recall the map in $C_{fil}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{r}}^{pet})$

$$m \circ (OL_X \otimes I) : \Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_p \to \Omega^{\bullet}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}}(\log D_{\mathbb{C}_p}), \ w \otimes \lambda \mapsto \lambda \cdot w$$

given in section 2. Hence for $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$ such that $w(\alpha) \in F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$ (see definition 1), there exists $(\lambda_i)_{1 \leq i \leq n} \in \mathbb{Z}_p$ and

$$(w_{Li})_{1 \le i \le n} \in \mathbb{H}^{j}_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\bullet \ge l}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}})$$

such that

$$w(\alpha) = \sum_{1 \le i \le n} \lambda_i \cdot w_{Li} \in \mathbb{H}^j_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\bullet \ge l}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}}(\log D_{\mathbb{C}_p})) = F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}), \ w_{Li} := H^j OL_X(w_{Li}).$$

Proof. See [4] proposition 2. We recall the proof. By [1], $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$ is such that $w(\alpha) \in F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$ if and only if there exists an w-contractile pro etale cover $(r_i : X_i \to X)_{1 \le i \le r}$ such that

$$w(\alpha) \in H^{j}\Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega^{\bullet \geq l}_{X^{\mathcal{O}}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}}(\log D^{\mathcal{O}}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}) \otimes_{O_{\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}}}} O\mathbb{B}_{st,\bar{X}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}},\log})^{\phi_{p}},$$

note that the differentials of the De Rham complex $DR(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})(O\mathbb{B}_{st,\bar{X}_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}},\log)$ commutes with the Frobenius action. On the other hand, the sequence

$$\begin{array}{l} 0 \to \Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \log, \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet \geq l} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p}) \xrightarrow{\Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, m \circ (OL_{X} \otimes I))} \Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}}^{\bullet \geq l} \left(\log D_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}^{\mathcal{O}}\right) \otimes_{O_{X}^{\mathcal{O}}} O\mathbb{B}_{st, X_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}}\right) \\ \xrightarrow{\Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, (\phi_{p} - I) \otimes_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}^{\bullet} \mathbb{C}_{p})} \Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}}^{\bullet \geq l} \left(\log D_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}^{\mathcal{O}}\right) \otimes_{O_{X}^{\mathcal{O}}} O\mathbb{B}_{st, X_{\hat{k}\sigma_{p}}}\right) \to 0 \end{array}$$

is exact since it is exact modulo p^n for each $n \in \mathbb{N}$, $n \leq 1$ by [5] for n = 1 and devissage for $n \leq 2$, and by the properties of *w*-contractile pro-etale affine covers (see [2]). Hence $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$ is such that $w(\alpha) \in F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$ if and only if

$$w(\alpha) \in H^{j}\Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathfrak{C}_{p}}^{\bullet}}^{\bullet\geq l}(\log D_{\tilde{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}) \otimes_{O_{\bar{X}^{\mathcal{O}}}} O\mathbb{B}_{st,\bar{X}_{\tilde{k}_{\sigma_{p}}},\log})^{\phi_{p}}$$
$$= H^{j}\Gamma(X_{\bullet}, m \circ (OL_{X} \otimes I))(H^{j}\Gamma(X_{\bullet,\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathfrak{C}_{p}},\log,\mathcal{O}}^{\bullet\geq l} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p})) = \mathbb{H}^{j}_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\log,\mathcal{O}}^{\bullet\geq l} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p}).$$

Proposition 4. Let k a field of finite type over \mathbb{Q} . Denote \bar{k} the algebraic closure of k. Denote $G := Gal(\bar{k}/k)$ its absolute Galois group. Let $X \in SmVar(k)$ a smooth variety. Take a compactification $\bar{X} \in PSmVar(k)$ of X such that $D := \bar{X} \setminus X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor, and denote $j : X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ the open embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$. Denote $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_p} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$ being the p-adic competion with respect to the p adic norm induced by σ_p . Then $\hat{G}_{\sigma_p} := Gal(\mathbb{C}_p/\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}) \subset G := Gal(\bar{k}/k)$. Let $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$. Consider then its associated De Rham class (see definition 1)

$$w(\alpha) := H^j R\alpha(X)(\alpha \otimes 1) \in H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}) \otimes_{\mathbb{C}_p} \mathbb{B}_{dr,\mathbb{C}_p}.$$

Then $\alpha \in H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)(l)^{\hat{G}_{\sigma_p}}$ if and only if $w(\alpha) \in F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}}) = F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}) \cap H^j_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}})$. That is we have

$$H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\mathbb{Z}_{p})(l)^{\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}}\otimes_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}\mathbb{Q}_{p} = \langle F^{l}H^{j}_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}})\cap H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\mathbb{Z}_{p})\rangle_{\mathbb{Q}_{p}} \subset H^{j}_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}},\mathbb{Z}_{p,X^{et}})\otimes\mathbb{B}_{dr,\mathbb{C}_{p}},$$

where $\langle - \rangle_{\mathbb{Q}_p}$ denote the \mathbb{Q}_p vector space generated by (-). Note that $H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$ and $F^l H^j_{DR}(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_p}})$ are canonically embedded as subabelian groups of $H^j_{et}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \mathbb{Z}_{p,X^{et}}) \otimes \mathbb{B}_{dr,\mathbb{C}_p}$ by $(-) \otimes 1$ and $\alpha(X) \circ ((-) \otimes 1)$ respectively.

Proof. Follows immediately from the fact that $H^j R\alpha(X)$ is a filtered quasi-isomorphism compatible with the Galois action of \hat{G}_{σ_p} by [1].

These propositions, together with the results of section 3 implies the Tate conjecture :

- **Theorem 2.** (i) Let k a field of finite type over \mathbb{Q} . Let $X \in PSmVar(k)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for X.
- (ii) Let p a prime number. Let K a p-adic field, that is a finite extension of \mathbb{Q}_p . Let $X \in PSmVar(K)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for X.

(iii) Let p a prime number. Let k_0 a field of characteristic p. Let $X_0 \in PSmVar(k_0)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for X_0 .

Proof. (i):Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_p : k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_p$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_p} \subset \mathbb{C}_p$, where \hat{k}_{σ_p} is the *p*-adic field which is the completion of *k* with respect the *p* adic norm given by σ_p . Let $\alpha \in H^{2d}_{et}(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_p)(d)^G$. Using definition 1, by proposition 3 and proposition 4 there exists $(\lambda_i)_{1 \leq i \leq n} \in \mathbb{Z}_p$ and

$$(w_{Li})_{1 \le i \le n} \in \mathbb{H}^{2d}_{pet}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega^{\bullet \ge d}_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \log, \mathcal{O}})$$

such that

$$w(\alpha) = \sum_{1 \le i \le n} \lambda_i \cdot w_{Li} \in \mathbb{H}_{pet}^{2d}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_p}}^{\bullet \ge d}) = F^d H_{DR}^{2d}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}), \ w_{Li} := H^{2d}OL_X(w_{Li}).$$

By theorem 1(ii) and (iii), there exists $Z_i \in \mathcal{Z}^d(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$ such that $w_{Li} = [Z_i] \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$. Hence,

$$Z := \sum_{1 \le i \le n} \lambda_i[Z_i] \in \mathcal{Z}^d(X_{\mathbb{C}_p}) \otimes \mathbb{Q}_p$$

satisfies $w(\alpha) = [Z] \in H^{2d}_{DR}(X_{\mathbb{C}_p})$. By [1], we get $\alpha = [Z] \in H^{2d}_{et}(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_p)$. Since [Z] is G invariant,

$$Z' := 1/card(gZ, g \in G) \sum_{g \in G} gZ \in \mathcal{Z}^d(X) \otimes \mathbb{Q}_p$$

satisfy $[Z'] = [Z] = \alpha \in H^{2d}_{et}(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_p).$ (ii):Similar to (i). (iii):Follows from (ii) by taking $X \in PSmVar(K)$ with $K := Frac(W(k_0))$, such that $X \otimes_K k_0 = X_0$. \Box

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
