# De Rham logarithmic classes and Tate conjecture

#### Abstract

We introduce the definition of De Rham logarithmic classes. We show that the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle of an algebraic variety over a field of characteristic zero is logarithmic and conversely that a logarithmic class of bidegree $(d, d)$ is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension $d$ ). We deduce from a previous work the Tate conjecture for smooth projective varieties over fields of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$, over $p$-adic fields and over field of characteristic $p, p$ being a prime number.


## 1 Introduction

In this work, we introduce for $X$ a noetherian scheme, the definition of logarithmic De Rham cohomology classes which are for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the subgroup $H^{j} O L_{X}\left(\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}\right)\right) \subset \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)=: H_{D R}^{j}(X)$ of the De Rham cohomology abelian group. Let $X$ a smooth connected variety over a field of characteristic zero. To an algebraic cycle $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ one can associate its De Rham cohomology class $[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$, which is by definition, as for any Weil cohomology theory, the image of the fundamental class $[Z] \in H_{D R, Z}^{2 d}(X)$ by the canonical morphism $H_{D R, Z}^{2 d}(X) \rightarrow H^{2 d}(X)$. In section 3, we show (c.f. theorem 1(i)) that $[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$ is logarithmic of bidegree $(d, d)$, that is

[Z]=H^{2 d} O L_{X}([Z]) \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X),[Z] \in H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)
$$

where $H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right) \subset \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}\right)$ is the canonical subspace. The main ingredient is that the Euler class of a vector bundle of rank $d$ over an algebraic variety is logarithmic of bidegree ( $d, d$ ) (c.f. proposition 1). Conversely, we show (c.f. theorem 1(ii)), that a logarithmic class $w \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$ of bidegree ( $d, d$ ) is the De Rham class of an algebraic cycle (of codimension $d$ ). The point is that a logarithmic class of bidegree $(p, q)$ is locally acyclic for the Zariski topology of $X$ since it is the etale cohomology of a single sheaf. This allows us to proceed by a finite induction and we use at the final step the fact that for a scheme $X^{\prime}, H_{e t}^{1}\left(X^{\prime}, \Omega_{X^{\prime}, \log }^{1}\right)=H^{1}\left(X^{\prime}, O_{X^{\prime}}^{*}\right)$ is the Picard group of $X^{\prime}$. In the case $X$ projective, we also get a vanishing result (c.f. theorem $1(\mathrm{iii})): H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d-k}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d-k}\right)\right)=0$ for $k>0$.

In a previous work (see [4], prop 2,3), we show that Tate classes $\alpha \in H^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(d)^{G}$ of a smooth algebraic variety $X$ over a subfield of $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ gives by the comparison isomorphism

a sum of $\mathbb{Z}_{p}$ multiple of logarithmic classes

with for each $1 \leq i \leq s, w(\alpha)_{L, i} \in H^{2 d} O L_{X} \mathbb{H}_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{\bar{X}_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \log }^{d}\right)$. We deduce, for $X$ projective, by theorem 1(ii) and (iii), the Tate cojecture (c.f. theorem 2).

## 2 Preliminaries and Notations

- Denote by Top the category of topological spaces and RTop the category of ringed spaces.
- Denote by Cat the category of small categories and RCat the category of ringed topos.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in$ Cat and $X \in \mathcal{S}$, we denote $\mathcal{S} / X \in$ Cat the category whose objects are $Y / X:=(Y, f)$ with $Y \in \mathcal{S}$ and $f: Y \rightarrow X$ is a morphism in $\mathcal{S}$, and whose morphisms $\operatorname{Hom}\left(\left(Y^{\prime}, f^{\prime}\right),(Y, f)\right)$ consists of $g: Y^{\prime} \rightarrow Y$ in $\mathcal{S}$ such that $f \circ g=f^{\prime}$.
- For $\mathcal{S} \in \operatorname{Cat}$ denote $\operatorname{Gr} \mathcal{S}:=\operatorname{Fun}(\mathbb{Z}, \mathcal{S})$ is the category of graded objects.
- Denote by Ab the category of abelian groups. For $R$ a ring denote by $\operatorname{Mod}(R)$ the category of (left) $R$ modules. We have then the forgetful functor $o_{R}: \operatorname{Mod}(R) \rightarrow \mathrm{Ab}$.
- Denote by AbCat the category of small abelian categories.
- For $\left(\mathcal{S}, O_{S}\right) \in$ RCat a ringed topos, we denote by

For $F \in C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$, we denote by $k: F \rightarrow E_{\tau}(F)$ the canonical flasque resolution in $C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$ (see [3]). In particular for $X \in \mathcal{S}, H^{*}\left(X, E_{\tau}(F)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $\mathbb{H}_{\tau}^{*}(X, F)$.
- For $f: \mathcal{S}^{\prime} \rightarrow \mathcal{S}$ a morphism with $\mathcal{S}, \mathcal{S}^{\prime} \in$ RCat, endowed with topology $\tau$ and $\tau^{\prime}$ respectively, we denote for $F \in C_{O_{S}}(\mathcal{S})$ and each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$,

the diagram of constant presheaves on $\mathcal{X}$.

- Denote by Sch $\subset$ RTop the subcategory of schemes (the morphisms are the morphisms of locally ringed spaces). For $X \in S c h$, we denote by
$-\operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X \subset \operatorname{Sch} / X$ the full subcategory consisting of objects $X^{\prime} / X=\left(X^{\prime}, f\right) \in \operatorname{Sch} / X$ such that $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ is an morphism of finite type
$-X^{e t} \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X$ the full subcategory consisting of objects $U / X=(X, h) \in \operatorname{Sch} / X$ such that $h: U \rightarrow X$ is an etale morphism.
$-X^{s m} \subset \operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X$ the full subcategory consisting of objects $U / X=(X, h) \in \operatorname{Sch} / X$ such that $h: U \rightarrow X$ is a smooth morphism.

For a field $k$, we consider $\operatorname{Sch} / k:=\operatorname{Sch} / \operatorname{Spec} k$ the category of schemes over Spec $k$. We then denote by
$-\operatorname{Var}(k)=\operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / k \subset \operatorname{Sch} / k$ the full subcategory consisting of algebraic varieties over $k$, i.e. schemes of finite type over $k$,
$-\mathrm{P} \operatorname{Var}(k) \subset \mathrm{QP} \operatorname{Var}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of quasi-projective varieties and projective varieties respectively,

- PSmVar $(k) \subset \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k) \subset \operatorname{Var}(k)$ the full subcategories consisting of smooth varieties and smooth projective varieties respectively.

For a morphism of field $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow K$, we have the extention of scalar functor

The adjonction maps are

- for $X \in \operatorname{Sch} / k$, the projection $\pi_{k / K}(X): X_{K} \rightarrow X$ in Sch $/ k$, for $X=\cup_{i} X_{i}$ an affine open cover with $X_{i}=\operatorname{Spec}\left(A_{i}\right)$ we have by definition $\pi_{k / K}\left(X_{i}\right)=n_{k / K}\left(A_{i}\right)$,
- for $X \in \operatorname{Sch} / K, I \times \Delta_{K}: X \hookrightarrow X_{K}=X \times_{K} K \otimes_{k} K$ in Sch $/ K$, where $\Delta_{K}: K \otimes_{k} K \rightarrow K$ is the diagonal which is given by for $x, y \in K, \Delta_{K}(x, y)=x-y$.

The extention of scalar functor restrict to a functor

and for $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ we have $\pi_{k / K}(X): X_{K} \rightarrow X$ the projection in Sch $/ k$. An algebraic variety $X \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$ is said to be defined over $k$ if there exists $X_{0} \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ such that $X \simeq X_{0} \otimes_{k} K$ in $\operatorname{Var}(K)$. For $X=\left(X, a_{X}\right) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$, we have $\operatorname{Sch}^{f t} / X=\operatorname{Var}(k) / X$ since for $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ a morphism of schemes of finite type, $\left(X^{\prime}, a_{X} \circ f\right) \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ is the unique structure of variety over $k$ of $X^{\prime} \in$ Sch such that $f$ becomes a morphism of algebraic varieties over $k$, in particular we have

A morphism $f: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ with $X, X^{\prime} \in \operatorname{Var}(K)$ is said to be defined over $k$ if $X \simeq X_{0} \otimes_{k} K$ and $X^{\prime} \simeq X_{0}^{\prime} \otimes_{k} K$ are defined over $k$ and $\Gamma_{f}=\Gamma_{f_{0}} \otimes_{k} K \subset X^{\prime} \times X$ is defined over $k$, so that $f_{0} \otimes_{k} K=f$ with $f_{0}: X_{0}^{\prime} \rightarrow X_{0}$.

- For $X \in$ Sch, we denote $X^{\text {pet }} \subset$ Sch $/ X$ the pro etale site (see [2]) which is the full subcategory of Sch / $X$ whose object consists of weakly etale maps $U \rightarrow X$ (that is flat maps $U \rightarrow X$ such that $\Delta_{U}: U \rightarrow U \times_{X} U$ is also flat) and whose topology is generated by fpqc covers. We then have the canonical morphism of site

- An affine scheme $U \in$ Sch is said to be $w$-contractible if any faithfully flat weakly etale map $V \rightarrow U$, $V \in$ Sch, admits a section. We will use the facts that (see [2]):
- Any scheme $X \in$ Sch admits a pro-etale affine cover $\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{i \in I}$ with for each $i \in I, X_{i}$ a $w$-contractile affine scheme and $r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X$ a weakly etale map. For $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$ with $k$ a field, we may assume $I$ finite since the topological space $X$ is then quasi-compact.
- If $U \in \operatorname{Sch}$ is a $w$-contractible affine scheme, then for any sheaf $F \in \operatorname{Shv}\left(U^{p e t}\right), H_{p e t}^{i}(U, F)=0$ for $i \neq 0$ since $\Gamma(U,-)$ is an exact functor.
- Let $X=\left(X, O_{X}\right) \in$ RCat a ringed topos, we have in $C(X)$ the subcomplex of presheaves of abelian group

where $\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}:=D R(X)\left(O_{X}\right) \in C(X)$ is the De Rham complex and $\Gamma\left(X^{o}, O_{X}\right)^{*} \subset \Gamma\left(X^{o}, O_{X}\right)$ is the subring consisting of inversible elements for the multiplication.

- Let $X \in$ Sch. Considering its De Rham complex $\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}:=D R(X)\left(O_{X}\right)$, we have for $j \in \mathbb{Z}$ its De Rham cohomology $H_{D R}^{j}(X):=\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. If $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$, then $H_{D R}^{j}(X)=\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$ since $\Omega^{\bullet} \in C(\operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k))$ is $\mathbb{A}^{1}$ local and admits transfert (see [3]).
- Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. Let $X=\cup_{i=1}^{s} X_{i}$ an open affine cover. For $I \subset[1, \ldots, s]$, we denote $X_{I}:=\cap_{i \in I} X_{i}$. We get $X_{\bullet} \in \operatorname{Fun}(P([1, \ldots, s]), \operatorname{Var}(k))$. Since quasi-coherent sheaves on affine noetherian schemes are acyclic, we have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}, H_{D R}^{j}(X)=\Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet} \bullet\right)$.
- For $X \in$ Sch noetherian irreducible and $d \in \mathbb{N}$, we denote by $\mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$ the group of algebraic cycles of codimension $d$, which is the free abelian group generated by irreducible closed subsets of codimension d.
- Denote by $\operatorname{AnSp}(\mathbb{C}) \subset R T$ op the full subcategory of analytic spaces over $\mathbb{C}$, and by $\operatorname{AnSm}(\mathbb{C}) \subset$ $\operatorname{AnSp}(\mathbb{C})$ the full subcategory of smooth analytic spaces (i.e. complex analytic manifold). Denote by CW $\subset$ Top the full subcategory of $C W$ complexes. Denote by Diff $(\mathbb{R}) \subset$ RTop the full subcategory of differentiable (real) manifold.
- For $X \in$ Top and $Z \subset X$ a closed subset, denoting $j: X \backslash Z \hookrightarrow X$ the open complementary, we will consider

## 3 De Rham logarithmic classes

Let $X \in$ Sch. Recall we have the canonical subcomplex $O L_{X}: \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}$ in $C\left(X^{e t}\right)$. For $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the De Rham logarithmic classes consist of the image

The filtered complex $\Gamma\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X^{e t}, \text { log }}^{*}, F_{b}\right)\right) \in C_{f i l}(\mathbb{Z})$ has its differentials at the $E_{1}$ level trivial since all the logarithmic forms are closed, hence we have a canonical splitting

\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{\bullet}\right)=\oplus_{0 \leq l \leq j} H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right) .
$$

Let $X \in$ Sch a noetherian scheme. We have by definition the exact sequence in $C\left(X^{e t}\right)$

$$
0 \rightarrow \mathbb{Z}_{X} \rightarrow O_{X}^{*} \xrightarrow{\text { dlog }} \Omega_{X, \log } \rightarrow 0
$$

Hence $H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{1}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)$ and $H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{q}\left(X, O_{X}^{*}\right)=0$ for $q \leq 2$. Let $X \in$ Sch a noetherian proper scheme. We have $H^{0}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \text { log }}^{l}\right)=0$.

We will use the following lemma :
Lemma 1. Let $X \in$ Sch. Let $X=\cup_{i \in I} X_{i}$ an open cover. Denote $j_{i}: X_{i} \hookrightarrow X$ the open embeddings. Let $w \in H_{D R}^{j}(X)$. Then $w \in H^{j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)\right)$ if and only if $j_{i}^{*} w \in H^{j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j-l}\left(X_{i}, \Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)\right)$ for all $i \in I$.

Proof. The only if part is obvious. Considering the morphism of bicomplexes of abelian groups

$$
\Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, E_{e t}^{\bullet}\left(\Omega_{X, \log }^{l}\right)\right) \hookrightarrow \Gamma\left(X_{\bullet}, E_{e t}^{\bullet}\left(\Omega_{X}^{l}\right)\right)
$$

the if part follows from Mayer-Vietoris (i.e. etale hence Zariski descent of flasque etale sheaves).
Let $X \in$ Sch a smooth connected noetherian scheme ( $X$ is quasi-compact since $X$ is noetherian) and $Z \subset X$ a smooth subscheme of codimension d we have for each $j \in \mathbb{Z}$, the purity isomorphism given by excision (using the deformation $\left(\tilde{X}_{\tilde{\prime}}^{\prime}, \tilde{Z}_{\tilde{\prime}}^{\prime}\right) \rightarrow \mathbb{A}^{1},\left(\tilde{X}^{\prime}, \tilde{Z}^{\prime}\right) \in \operatorname{Sch}^{2}$ of a pair $\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right) \in \operatorname{Sch}^{2}$ by the normal cone $C_{Z^{\prime} / X^{\prime}} \rightarrow Z^{\prime}$, i.e. such that $\left(\tilde{X}^{\prime}, \tilde{Z}^{\prime}\right)_{s}=\left(X^{\prime}, Z^{\prime}\right)$ for $s^{\prime} \in \mathbb{A}^{1} \backslash 0$ and $\left.\left(\tilde{X}^{\prime}, \tilde{Z}^{\prime}\right)_{0}=\left(C_{Z^{\prime} / X}, Z^{\prime}\right)\right)$ and the cup product with the Euler class of of the normal tangent bundle $N_{Z / X} \rightarrow Z$ :

\left((-) \cdot e\left(N_{Z / X}\right)\right)^{-1}: H_{D R, Z}^{j}(X)=H_{D R, Z^{o}}^{j}\left(N_{Z / X}\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} H_{D R}^{j-2 d}(Z) .
$$

Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. For $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ connected, we have the cycle class map for De Rham cohomology

$$
\begin{array}{r}
Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X) \mapsto[Z]:=H^{2 d} \Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)([Z]) \subset H_{D R}^{2 d}(X),[Z] \in H_{D R,|Z|}^{2 d}(X) \\
H^{2 d} \Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right): H_{D R,|Z|}^{2 d}(X) \rightarrow H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)
\end{array}
$$

where

$$
\Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right):=\operatorname{Hom}\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\left(\mathbb{Z}_{X}\right), E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)\right): \Gamma_{Z}\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)\right) \hookrightarrow \Gamma\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)\right)
$$

and, as for any Weil cohomology theory, we have the purity isomorphism given by excision and the cup product with the Euler class of of the normal tangent bundle $N_{Z^{o} / X^{o}} \rightarrow Z^{o}, X^{o} \subset X$ being a open subset such that $Z^{o}:=X^{o} \cap Z$ has smooth components:

\left((-) \cdot e\left(N_{Z^{o} / X^{o}}\right)\right)^{-1}: H_{D R,|Z|}^{2 d}(X)=H_{D R,\left|Z^{o}\right|}^{2 d}\left(X^{o}\right)=H_{D R,\left|Z^{\circ}\right|}^{2 d}\left(N_{Z^{o} / X^{o}}\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} H_{D R}^{0}\left(\left|Z^{o}\right|\right)
$$

where the first equality follows from dimension reason : for $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ and $Z^{\prime} \subset X$ smooth, we have $H_{D R, Z^{\prime}}^{i}(X)=0$ for $i<2 \operatorname{codim}\left(Z^{\prime}, X\right)$ by the purity isomorphism.

We have the following key proposition:
Proposition 1. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $p: E \rightarrow X$ a vector bundle of rank $d \in \mathbb{N}$ with $X, E \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ connected. Then
(i) the Euler class $e(E) \in H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ is logarithmic of type $(d, d)$, that is $e(E)=H^{2 d} O L_{E}(e(E)) \in$ $H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ with $e(E) \in H_{X, e t}^{d}\left(E, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)$,
(ii) the Euler class $e(E) \in H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)$ induces for each $i, j \in \mathbb{Z}$ an isomorphism

((-) \cdot e(E)): H^{i+j} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{i}\right)\right) \xrightarrow{\sim} H^{2 d+i+j} O L_{E}\left(H_{e t}^{j+d}\left(E, \Omega_{E, \log }^{i+d}\right)\right) .
$$

Proof. (i):Let $X=\cup_{i} X_{i}$ an open affine cover such that $E_{i}:=E_{\mid X_{i}}$ is trivial : $\left(s_{1}, \cdots, s_{d}\right): E_{\mid X_{i}} \xrightarrow{\sim}$ $X_{i} \times \mathbb{A}^{d}$ with $s_{j} \in \Gamma\left(X_{i}, E\right)$. Then

$$
e(E)_{\mid X_{i}}=\partial\left(d s_{1} / s_{1} \wedge \cdots \wedge d s_{d} / s_{d}\right) \in H^{2 d} O L_{E_{i}}\left(H_{X_{i}}^{d}\left(E_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)\right)
$$

where $\partial: H^{d-1}\left(E_{i} \backslash X_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right) \rightarrow H_{X_{i}}^{d}\left(E_{i}, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)$ is the boundary map. Hence

e(E) \in H^{2 d} O L_{E}\left(H^{0}\left(E, H_{X}^{d} \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right)\right)=H_{e t, X}^{d}\left(E, \Omega_{E, \log }^{d}\right) \subset H^{0}\left(E, H_{X}^{2 d} \Omega_{E}^{\bullet \geq d}\right) \subset H_{D R, X}^{2 d}(E)
$$

(ii):Follows from (i) and Kunneth formula for De Rham cohomology together with lemma 1.

The result of this section is the following :
Theorem 1. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{Sm} \operatorname{Var}(k)$ connected. Let $d \in \mathbb{N}$.
(i) The De Rham cohomology class of an algebraic cycle is logarithmic and is of type $(d, d)$, that is, for $Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X)$

[Z]:=H^{2 d} \Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)([Z]) \subset H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right) \subset H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)
$$

(ii) Conversely, any $w \in H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)$ is the class of an algebraic cycle.
(iii) If $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k), H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t}^{d-k}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d+k}\right)\right)=0$ for $k>0$.

Proof. (i):We have

[Z]:=H^{2 d} \Omega\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)([Z])=H^{2 d} O L_{X} \circ H^{d} \Omega_{\log }^{d}\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)([Z]) \subset H_{D R}^{2 d}(X),[Z] \in H_{e t,|Z|}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)
$$

where

$$
\Omega_{\log }^{d}\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right):=\operatorname{Hom}\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\left(\mathbb{Z}_{X}\right), E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right): \Gamma_{Z}\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right) \hookrightarrow \Gamma\left(X, E_{e t}\left(\Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)
$$

since if $X^{o} \subset X$ is a Zariski open subset such that $Z^{o}:=X^{o} \cap Z$ has smooth components and $N_{Z^{\circ} / X^{o}} \rightarrow$ $Z^{o}$ is the normal tangent bundle, proposition 1 implies that the Euler class of $N_{Z^{\circ} / X^{\circ}}$ induces the isomorphism

\begin{aligned}
\left((-) \cdot e\left(N_{Z^{\circ} / X^{o}}\right)\right)^{-1}: H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t,|Z|}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right) & =H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t,\left|Z^{o}\right|}^{d}\left(X^{o}, \Omega_{X^{o}, \log }^{d}\right)\right) \\
& =H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(H_{e t,\left|Z^{\circ}\right|}^{d}\left(N_{Z^{o} / X^{o}}, \Omega_{N_{Z^{\circ} / X^{o},}^{d} \log }^{d}\right)\right) .
\end{aligned}
$$

Note that the excision isomorphism being motivic preserve logarithmic classes.
(ii):By assumption we have

w=H^{2 d} O L_{X}(w) \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X), w \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)
$$

As $\Omega_{X, \log }^{d} \in \operatorname{PSh}\left(X^{e t}\right)$ consist of a single presheaf, that is a complex of presheaves concentrated one degree, there exist an etale open cover $r=r(w)=\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{1 \leq i \leq s}$, depending on $w$, such that $r_{i}^{*} w=0 \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(X_{i}, \Omega_{X, \text { log }}^{d}\right)$ for each $i$. Choose $i=1$ and denote $j: U:=r_{1}\left(X_{1}\right) \hookrightarrow X$ the corresponding Zariski open subset. As $\Omega_{X, \log }^{d}$ has no torsion and admits transfert, we have $j^{*} w=0 \in H_{e t}^{d}\left(U, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)$. Hence, denoting $D:=X \backslash U$, we have

w=H^{2 d} O L_{X}(w), w \in \Omega_{\log }^{d}\left(\gamma_{D}^{\vee}\right)\left(H_{e t, D}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)

We may assume, up to shinking $U$, that $D \subset X$ is a divisor. Denote $D^{o} \subset D$ its smooth locus and $l: X^{o} \hookrightarrow X$ a Zariski open subset such that $X^{o} \cap D=D^{o}$. We then have by proposition 1

We repeat this procedure with each connected components of $D^{o}$ instead of $X$. By a finite induction of $d$ steps, we get

w=H^{2 d} O L_{X}(w), w \in \Omega_{\log }^{d}\left(\gamma_{Z}^{\vee}\right)\left(H_{e t, Z}^{d}\left(X, \Omega_{X, \log }^{d}\right)\right)
$$

with $Z:=D_{d} \subset \cdots \subset D \subset X$ a codimension $d$ Zariski closed subset and $w=[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}(X)$, using in the final step the isomorphism

$$
H_{e t}^{1}\left(D_{d-1}^{o}, \Omega_{D_{d-1}^{o}, \log }\right)=H_{e t}^{1}\left(D_{d-1}^{o}, O_{D_{d-1}}^{*}\right)=\operatorname{Pic}\left(D_{d-1}^{o}\right)
$$

(iii):Follows from the proof of (ii) and the fact that for $X^{\prime} \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(k), H^{0}\left(X^{\prime}, \Omega_{X^{\prime}, \log }^{l}\right)=0$ for all $l>0$.

Let $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ a subfield. Let $X \in \operatorname{Var}(k)$. We will write for short

O L_{X}:=O L_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}, \mathcal{O}}: \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet}:=\Omega_{X_{O_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}}^{e t}, \log }^{\bullet} \hookrightarrow \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}}^{\bullet e t}
$$

the embedding in $C\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}\right)$. We will also consider

m \circ\left(O L_{X} \otimes I\right): \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet p e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p}:=\Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet} \underline{\mathbb{Z}}_{X} \rightarrow \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\text {pet }}}^{\bullet}, w \otimes \lambda \mapsto \lambda \cdot w
$$

in $C\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\text {pet }}\right)$. Note that

\Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet p e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet}:=\nu_{X}^{*} \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet} \in C\left(X^{p e t}\right)
$$

but

$$
\underline{\mathbb{Z}_{p}}:=\lim _{\check{n \in \mathbb{N}}} \nu_{X}^{*}\left(\mathbb{Z} / p^{n} \mathbb{Z}\right)_{X^{e t}} \in C\left(X^{\text {pet }}\right), \text { and } \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet p e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet} \otimes \mathbb{Z}_{p} \in C\left(X^{\text {pet }}\right)
$$

are NOT the pullback of etale sheaves by $\nu_{X}$.
Proposition 2. Let $k$ a field of characteristic zero. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$. Let $\sigma: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ an embedding.
(i) Let $w \in H_{D R}^{j}(X):=\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)=\mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. If

w \in H^{j} O L_{X}\left(\mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{e t}, \log }^{\bullet}\right)\right)
$$

then $H^{j} e v(X)(w) \in H_{\text {sing }}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, 2 i \pi \mathbb{Q}\right)$.
(ii) Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number and $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$ an embedding. Let $j \in \mathbb{Z}$. Let $w \in H_{D R}^{j}(X):=$ $\mathbb{H}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)=\mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{j}\left(X, \Omega_{X}^{\bullet}\right)$. If

$$
w:=\pi_{k / \mathbb{C}_{p}}(X)^{*} w \in H^{j} O L_{X}\left(\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}\right)\right)
$$

then $H^{j} e v(X)(w) \in H_{\text {sing }}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}, 2 i \pi \mathbb{Q}\right)$. Recall that $\mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\bullet p e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet}\right)=\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}\right)$.
Proof. (i): Let

where $\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{1 \leq i \leq s}$ is an affine etale cover. Let $X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}=\cup_{i=1}^{r} \mathbb{D}_{i}$ an open cover with $\mathbb{D}_{i} \simeq D(0,1)^{d}$. Denote $j_{I J}: X_{I} \cap \mathbb{D}_{J} \hookrightarrow X_{I}$ the open embeddings. Then by definition $H^{j} \operatorname{ev}(X)(w)=H^{j} \operatorname{ev}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}\right)\left(j_{\bullet}^{*} \circ\right.$ $\left.\operatorname{an}_{X}^{*}, w\right)$ with

$$
j_{\bullet}^{*} \circ \operatorname{an}_{X \bullet}^{*} w \in H^{j} \Gamma\left(X_{\bullet, \mathbb{C}}^{a n} \cap \mathbb{D}_{\bullet}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{a n}}^{a_{n}}\right)
$$

Now, if $w=H^{j} O L_{X}\left(\mathbb{H}_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{e t}, \log }^{e}\right)\right)$, we have a canonical splitting

w=\sum_{l=0}^{j} w_{L}^{l, j-l}=\sum_{l=d}^{j} w^{l, j-l} \in H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}\right), w_{L}^{l, j-l} \in H^{j-l}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{e t}, \log }^{l}\right), w^{l, j-l}:=H^{j} O L_{X_{\mathbb{C}}^{e t}}\left(w_{L}^{l, j-l}\right) .
$$

Let $0 \leq l \leq j$. Using an affine w-contractile pro-etale cover of $X$, we see that there exists an affine etale cover $r=r\left(w^{l, j-l}\right)=\left(r_{i}: X_{i} \rightarrow X\right)_{1 \leq i \leq n}$ of $X$ (depending on $w^{l, j-l}$ ) such that

Note that since $X$ is an algebraic variety, this also follows from a comparison theorem between Chech cohomology of etale covers and etale cohomology. By [4] lemma, we may assume, up to take a desingularization $\pi: X^{\prime} \rightarrow X$ of $\left(X, \cup_{i}\left(r_{i}\left(X \backslash X_{i}\right)\right)\right.$ ) and replace $w$ with $\pi^{*} w$, that $r_{i}\left(X_{i}\right)=r_{i}\left(X_{i}(w)\right)=X \backslash D_{i}$ with $D_{i} \subset X$ smooth divisors with normal crossing For $1 \leq l \leq j$, we get

For $l=0$, we get

w^{0, j}=\left[\left(\lambda_{I}\right)\right] \in H^{j} \Gamma\left(X_{\mathbb{C}, I}, O_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}, I}}\right), \lambda_{I} \in \Gamma\left(X_{\mathbb{C}, I}, \mathbb{Z}_{X_{\mathbb{C}, I}^{e t}}\right)
$$

There exists $k^{\prime} \subset \mathbb{C}$ containing $k$ such that $w_{L, I}^{l, j-l} \in \Gamma\left(X_{k^{\prime}, I}, \Omega_{X_{k^{\prime}}}^{l}\right)$ for all $0 \leq l \leq j$. Take an embedding $\sigma^{\prime}: k^{\prime} \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}$ such that $\sigma_{\mid k}^{\prime}=\sigma$. We then have

where for each $(I, J, l)$ with $\operatorname{card} I+\operatorname{card} J+l=j$,

is NOT surjective in general since the left hand side is invariant by the action of the group $A u t(\mathbb{C})$ (the group of field automorphism of $\mathbb{C}$ ) whereas the right hand side is not. The fact for a de Rham cohomology class of being logarithmic is algebraic and invariant under isomorphism of (abstract) schemes.

Corollary 1. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSm} \operatorname{Var}(\mathbb{C})$. Then the Hodge conjecture holds for $X$ if and only if the Hodge classes are given by logarithmic De Rham classes.

Proof. Follows from theorem 1.

## 4 Tate conjecture

Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Denote $\bar{k}$ the algebraic closure of $k$ and $G=G a l(\bar{k} / k)$ the absolute Galois group of $k$. Let $X \in \operatorname{SmVar}(k)$ a smooth variety. Take a compactification $\bar{X} \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$ of $X$ such that $D:=\bar{X} \backslash X \subset X$ is a normal crossing divisor, and denote $j: X \hookrightarrow \bar{X}$ the open embedding. Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset$ $\mathbb{C}_{p}$, where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ is the $p$-adic field which is the completion of $k$ with respect the $p$ adic norm given by $\sigma_{p}$. Denote $\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}=\operatorname{Gal}\left(\mathbb{C}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)=\operatorname{Gal}\left(\overline{\mathbb{Q}}_{p} / \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}\right)$ the Galois group of $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$. Recall (see section 2) that $\underline{\mathbb{Z}}_{\underline{p}} X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}:=\lim _{\longleftarrow}{ }_{n \in \mathbb{N}} \nu_{X}^{*}\left(\mathbb{Z} / p^{n} \mathbb{Z}\right)_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{e t}} \in \operatorname{Shv}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{p e t}\right)$ and $\Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{p e t}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet}:=\Omega_{X_{O_{C_{p}}}^{p e t}, \log }^{\bullet} \in C\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}^{\text {pet }}\right)$. where for $j^{\prime}: U^{\prime} \hookrightarrow X^{\prime}$ an open embedding with $X^{\prime} \in$ RTop and $\tau$ a topology on RTop we denote for $m: j_{*} Q \rightarrow Q^{\prime}$ with $Q \in \mathrm{PSh}_{O}\left(U^{\prime}\right), Q^{\prime} \in \mathrm{PSh}_{O}\left(X^{\prime}\right)$ the canonical map in $C_{O}\left(X^{\prime}\right)$

If $\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}^{\mathcal{O}}, N_{U, \mathcal{O}}\right)$ is log smooth, we consider an hypercover

Then $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(l)^{\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}}$ if and only if $w(\alpha) \in F^{l} H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right)=F^{l} H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right) \cap H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right)$. That is we have

$$
H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(l)^{\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}} \otimes_{\mathbb{Z}_{p}} \mathbb{Q}_{p}=<F^{l} H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right) \cap H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)>_{\mathbb{Q}_{p}} \subset H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p, X^{e t}}\right) \otimes \mathbb{B}_{d r, \mathbb{C}_{p}}
$$

where $<->\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ denote the $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$ vector space generated by $(-)$. Note that $H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)$ and $F^{l} H_{D R}^{j}\left(X_{\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}}\right)$ are canonically embedded as subabelian groups of $H_{e t}^{j}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p, X^{e t}}\right) \otimes \mathbb{B}_{d r, \mathbb{C}_{p}}$ by $(-) \otimes 1$ and $\alpha(X) \circ((-) \otimes 1)$ respectively.

Proof. Follows immediately from the fact that $H^{j} R \alpha(X)$ is a filtered quasi-isomorphism compatible with the Galois action of $\hat{G}_{\sigma_{p}}$ by [1].

These propositions, together with the results of section 3 implies the Tate conjecture :
Theorem 2. (i) Let $k$ a field of finite type over $\mathbb{Q}$. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(k)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for $X$.
(ii) Let $p$ a prime number. Let $K$ a p-adic field, that is a finite extension of $\mathbb{Q}_{p}$. Let $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(K)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for $X$.
(iii) Let $p$ a prime number. Let $k_{0}$ a field of characteristic $p$. Let $X_{0} \in \operatorname{PSmVar}\left(k_{0}\right)$. Then the Tate conjecture holds for $X_{0}$.

Proof. (i):Let $p \in \mathbb{N}$ a prime number. Consider an embedding $\sigma_{p}: k \hookrightarrow \mathbb{C}_{p}$. Then $k \subset \bar{k} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$ and $k \subset \hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}} \subset \mathbb{C}_{p}$, where $\hat{k}_{\sigma_{p}}$ is the $p$-adic field which is the completion of $k$ with respect the $p$ adic norm given by $\sigma_{p}$. Let $\alpha \in H_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)(d)^{G}$. Using definition 1 , by proposition 3 and proposition 4 there exists $\left(\lambda_{i}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq n} \in \mathbb{Z}_{p}$ and

$$
\left(w_{L i}\right)_{1 \leq i \leq n} \in \mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \log , \mathcal{O}}^{\bullet \geq d}\right)
$$

such that

$$
w(\alpha)=\sum_{1 \leq i \leq n} \lambda_{i} \cdot w_{L i} \in \mathbb{H}_{p e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}, \Omega_{X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}}^{\bullet \geq d}\right)=F^{d} H_{D R}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right), w_{L i}:=H^{2 d} O L_{X}\left(w_{L i}\right)
$$

By theorem 1(ii) and (iii), there exists $Z_{i} \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right)$ such that $w_{L i}=\left[Z_{i}\right] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right)$. Hence,

$$
Z:=\sum_{1 \leq i \leq n} \lambda_{i}\left[Z_{i}\right] \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right) \otimes \mathbb{Q}_{p}
$$

satisfies $w(\alpha)=[Z] \in H_{D R}^{2 d}\left(X_{\mathbb{C}_{p}}\right)$. By [1], we get $\alpha=[Z] \in H_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)$. Since [ $\left.Z\right]$ is $G$ invariant,

$$
Z^{\prime}:=1 / \operatorname{card}(g Z, g \in G) \sum_{g \in G} g Z \in \mathcal{Z}^{d}(X) \otimes \mathbb{Q}_{p}
$$

satisfy $\left[Z^{\prime}\right]=[Z]=\alpha \in H_{e t}^{2 d}\left(X_{\bar{k}}, \mathbb{Z}_{p}\right)$.
(ii):Similar to (i).
(iii):Follows from (ii) by taking $X \in \operatorname{PSmVar}(K)$ with $K:=\operatorname{Frac}\left(W\left(k_{0}\right)\right)$, such that $X \otimes_{K} k_{0}=X_{0}$.
