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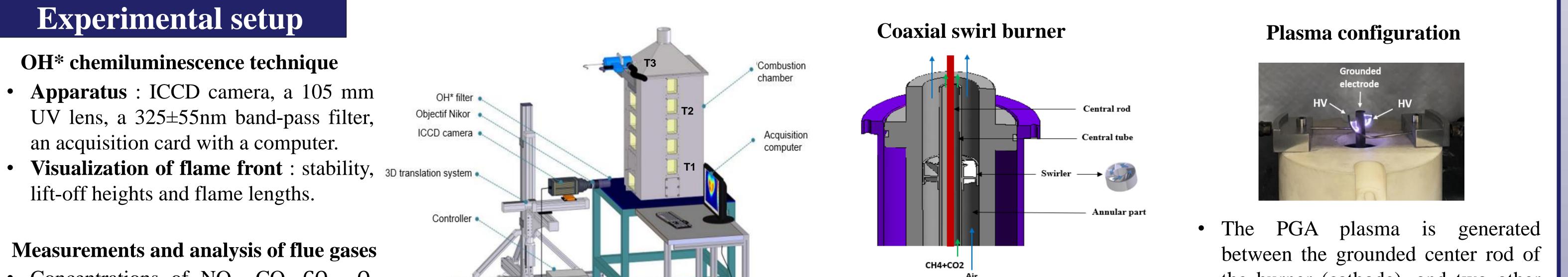
# Effects of pulsed gliding arc plasma on non-premixed CH<sub>4</sub>/CO<sub>2</sub>-Air flame stability

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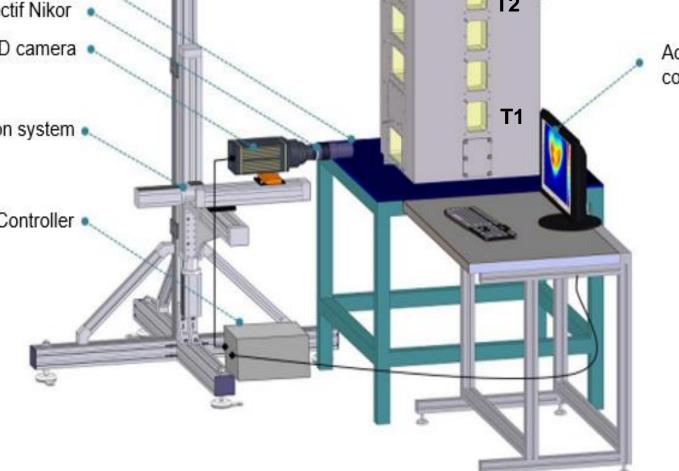


**Investigation of flame characteristics:** 

- Effects of CO<sub>2</sub> addition to the fuel on flame stability and pollutant emissions.
- **Study of pulsed gliding arc plasma (PGA) assisted combustion:**
- Impact of PGA plasma on the characteristics of non-premixed  $CH_4/CO_2$ -Air flames in a coaxial swirl burner.

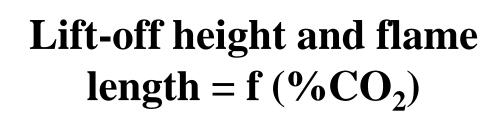


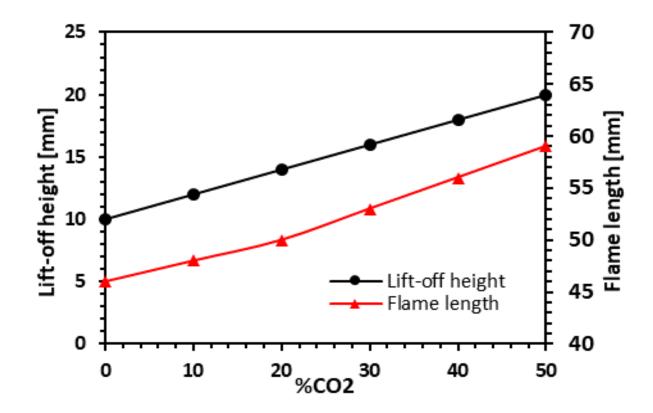
- Concentrations of  $NO_x$ , CO,  $CO_2$ ,  $O_2$ and  $SO_2$  in flue gases are measured.
- HORIBA PG250 multi-gas analyzer.

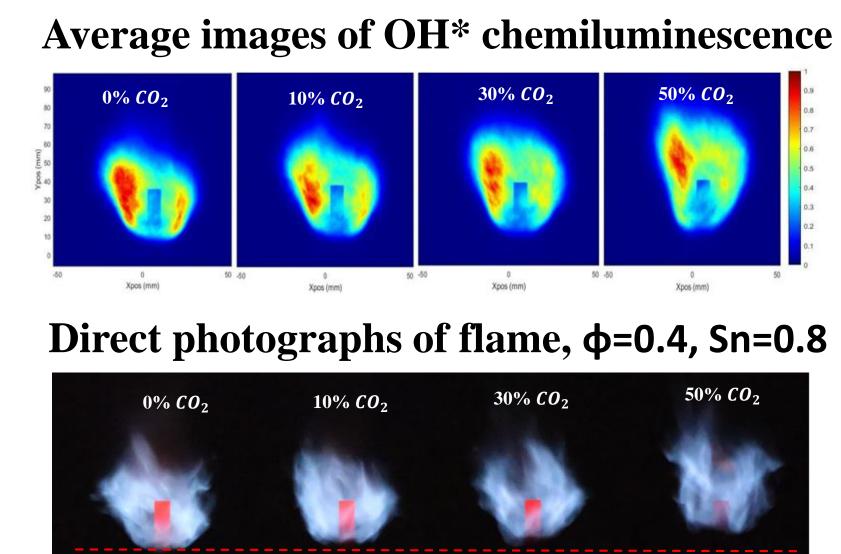


- 2 concentric tubes with a swirler in the annular part and a central metal rod used as a cathode for the plasma.
- the burner (cathode), and two other voltage (HV) high electrodes symmetrically placed around the central rod.

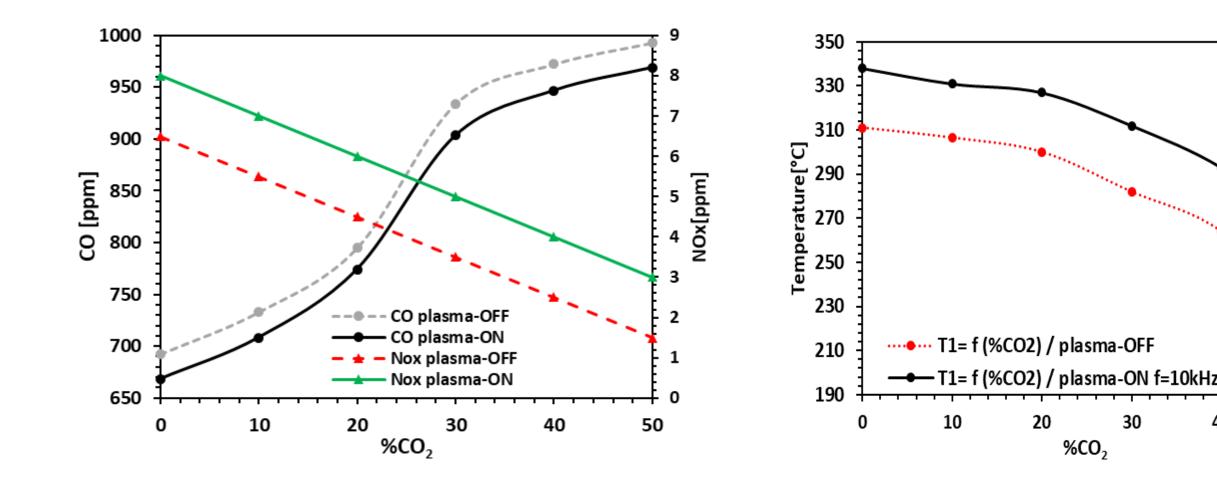

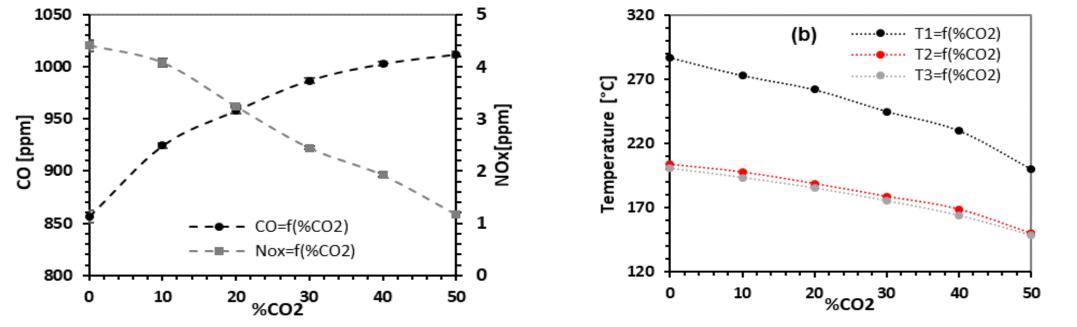
Effect of PGA plasma on (a) NO<sub>x</sub> and CO emissions; (b) Combustion gas temperature (T1) with plasma-OFF and plasma-ON



 $\succ$  Same trend followed by the pollutant emissions (CO and NO<sub>x</sub>) and the temperature

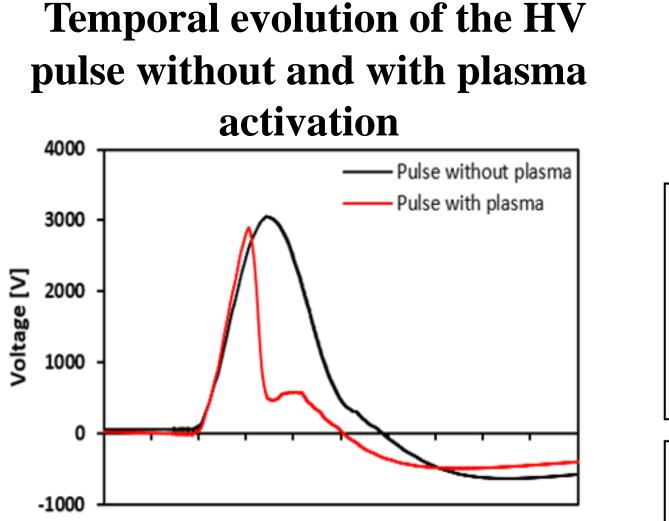
 $\succ$   $L_f$  with the addition of CO<sub>2</sub> to the fuel due to the decrease of flame burning velocity and flame temperature which disadvantages the flame stabilization.

 $NO_x$  and CO emissions = f (% CO<sub>2</sub>); (b) Flue gases temperature (at 3 different positions in the combustion chamber) =  $f(\% CO_2)$ 

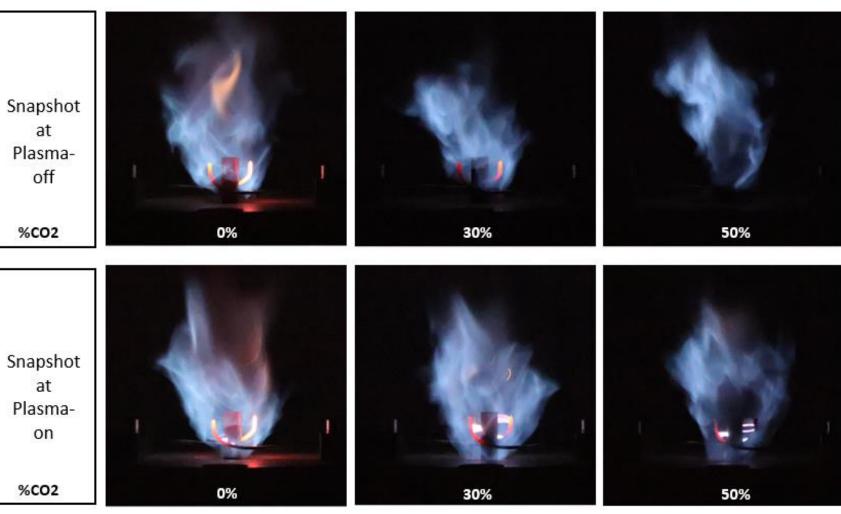


 $\blacktriangleright$  Increasing 50% of CO<sub>2</sub> in the fuel increases CO to 18% in flue gases  $\rightarrow$  Due to thermal dissociation of  $CO_2$  in the high-temperature regions of the flame.

 $\succ$  Low concentration of NO<sub>x</sub> in both cases without and with addition of CO<sub>2</sub>.

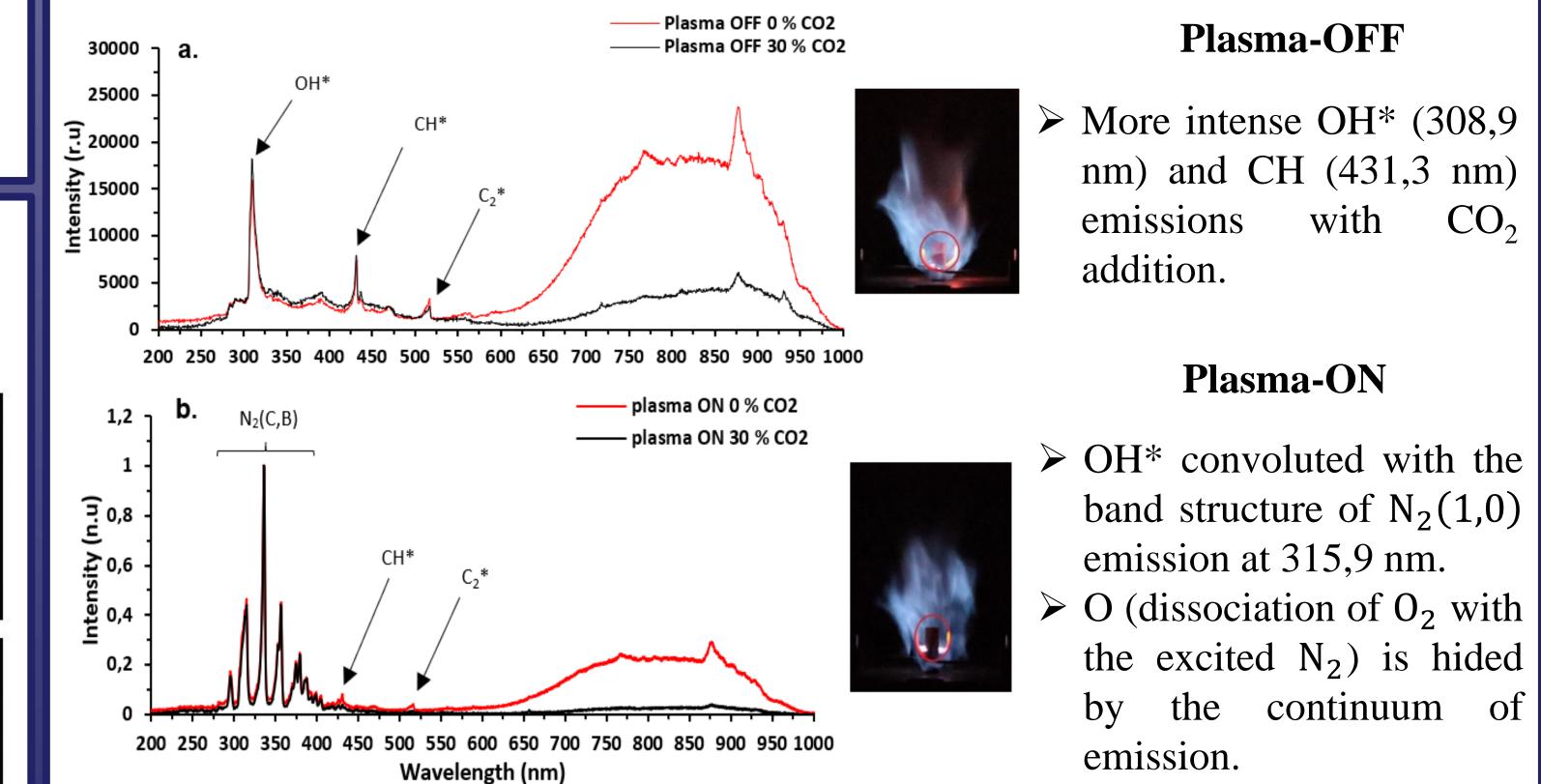


**Direct photographs of the flame in the case of** plasma-OFF and plasma-ON (f=10kHz) = f(%CO<sub>2</sub>), φ=0.4, Sn=0.8



- T1 in both cases plasma-OFF and plasma-ON.
- $\succ$  Addition of 50% of CO<sub>2</sub> to the fuel decreases the temperature T1 by 22%  $\rightarrow$  Due to thermal and radiative properties of  $CO_2$ .
- $\triangleright$  Plasma activation (at f=10kHz) increases the temperature T1 by nearly 12%.
- $\succ$  Slight decrease of CO emissions with plasma  $\rightarrow$  The enhance in conversion of CO to  $CO_2$  with plasma.
- $\succ$  Low concentration of NO<sub>x</sub> that remains almost same in both cases plasma-ON and Plasma-OFF.

Emission spectra of (a.) CH<sub>4</sub>-Air and CH<sub>4</sub>/CO<sub>2</sub>-Air flames and (b.) plasmaflames. The integration time is 2 s in (a.) and 0.4 s in (b.)



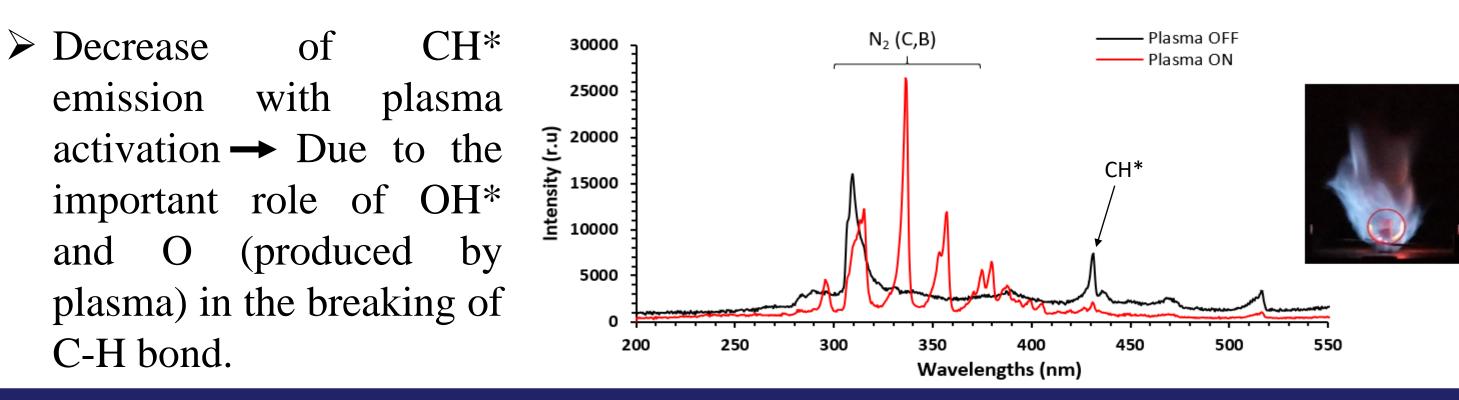
- 8 Time [µs]
- Pulse frequency fixed at 10kHz, for both HV electrodes.
- The applied voltage is measured at between 3 and  $3,5kV \pm 350V$ different operational the at conditions.
- ➢ With the presence of PGA plasma, the lift-off height decreases, by nearly a half time the initial one without plasma.

## Conclusion

- The addition of  $CO_2$  to the fuel leads to an increase of CO and a slight decrease of NOx, with a reduction of combustion gases temperature.
- PGA plasma plays a role to stabilize the flame, the lift-off heights of the flames decrease with the presence of PGA plasma (due to the  $N_2^*$  production). - PGA plasma decreases CO (about 3%) production.
